A Bible Study For Small Groups

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This was originally an expository series of sermons given in the church where I was serving as Pastor. A few years later, they were edited to be used as a Bible Study. There are a few things I feel I should share with you before using this material:

First: I had no intent of sharing or publishing this material until encouraged to do so by some friends. While I did consult several commentaries as I was preparing the original sermon series, I did not make notes of the references used in the messages. There was not in the beginning, nor is there now, any intent to plagiarize. Should you see anything you feel is the original thought of another, I ask for your grace and mercy.

Second: In my notes for teaching (or preaching), I tend to spell certain words phonetically for the purpose of emphasis. When transforming these notes from sermon notes to teaching notes, I felt inclined to leave a number of these phonetic spellings. They help me to make emphasis in the lesson at particular points.

Third: In my notes for teaching (or preaching), I make little effort to conform to rules of grammar. One example is that I often use a hyphen (-) to indicate a point where I may want to pause slightly and to keep certain thoughts connected as I speak. Another example is that I will use local colloquialisms to make points in the message.

Please accept that these notes are not an academic work. But I do hope they will help the preacher or teacher to be able to more quickly prepare their own sermon or teaching.

This Study is designed to help discover a practical message, from the Book of Revelations, which can be applied to our everyday life. It is designed for use in a Small Group setting. Each person in the Small Group should read and complete the assignments for the week before coming to the Small Group meeting. The Small Group meeting will provide an opportunity for each person to share what they have learned and to ask questions regarding the week's study materials.



The Latter Times:

Read 1 Timothy 4:1 and make notes:

Paul was reminding Timothy of the apostasy which had been foretold and was expected to come about in the church. It was coming sometime during the Church age and before Christ second coming. Paul does not say these things would happen "just before" the end of time. He simply states these things will take place sometime during the last dispensation of time and it would happen before Christ returns.

All of the following Scriptures from the New Testament are accepted by most Bible scholars as referring to the time prior to Christ's second return:

Acts 2:17;

Joel 2:28-32 - It was the belief of Jewish Rabbis that the time referred to in this text is the time which extends from the coming of the Messiah to the end of the world;

James 5:3 - Many Bible scholars agree that this IS NOT referring to the last days of an individual's life and it isn't referring to the last days before the national judgment of the Jews in the destruction of the temple. This interpretation keeps this verse in harmony with the rest of the letter of James;

James 5:7 speaks of the "later rain";

James 5:8 speaks of the "coming of the Lord";

James 5;9 states the "Judge is standing at the door!"

2 Peter 3:3;

Hebrews 1:2 - In this text, the phrase, "These last days", is used to refer to the time when Jesus was on the earth, teaching men;


1 Peter 1:20 - Here the time when Jesus, the Messiah, was revealed is called "these last days." Again, here is a reference to the time of Jesus on earth being called "last days";


Jude 1:18;

1 Peter 1:3-5

The Apostle Paul clearly understood the "later times" and "last days" to include all the messianic age, because he discusses things that were foretold to happen in the "last days" as taking place in his lifetime. (1 Tim 4:1, Heb 1:2)

When you consider the predictions of believers abandoning the faith, some following after deceiving spirits, gold and silver becoming worthless (corroding), scoffers coming on the scene, and people following their own evil desires; what is your general attitude toward these "Last Days"? Is it fear, apprehension, concern, anxiety? Explain.
How does the promise of Believers being shielded by God's power in the "last time" (1 Peter 1:3-5 above) affect your attitude toward these "last days"?
Read 2 Timothy 3:1 and make notes:
Paul says there "will be" terrible times in the last days. This speaks of a future time (will be). Since Paul has already been shown to see himself as living in the "last days," this is referring to an experience which is still to come in the era known as the "last days."





Some key words to every Believer are found in this text; "see to it that you are not alarmed." God has not given us a spirit of fear. The wars, famines, earthquakes, and other natural as well as man made catastrophes should not alarm us. We certainly should not run around screaming "this is the end." The end is "still to come." These are simply indications that we are in fact living in the "latter times" or "last days."

Imagine another Believer begins sharing with you their fear resulting from all the reports of wars, rumors of wars, earthquakes, famines, etc. Write out a response you could share with them.


The phrase "last days", "later times", etc. usually refers to the apostolic age. In these verses it is pointing to some future time that appears to be near, if not immediately, at hand. This future time, which is at hand, is also the end of the apostolic age as we see in:

Read 1 John 2:18 and make notes:

The phrase "in the last days" is a phrase that was used by the Old Testament prophets so it was not a new or strange concept to the first century Believers.

Read Isaiah 2:2; Micah 4:1 and make notes:

Jewish Rabbis teach that these two passages refer to "the age of the Messiah." Most religions of that day viewed their god as residing on a high hill or mountain. When more than one god was recognized, the more powerful the god, the higher their mountain upon which they resided. This prophecy is declaring in the "last days" the mountain of our Lord's temple will be undeniably higher than all others (chief among the mountains).



Read Acts 2:16 and make notes:

The apostle Peter understood the "last days" to encompass the whole messianic age. When Peter quoted Joel 2:28 as recorded in Acts 2:17 he declared prophecy concerning the "last days" was being fulfilled that very day. As a gauge of the times, the Bible has given us three types of people to watch. These are:

-1. the "evil ones"


The "evil men" will grow worse and worse as time allows.

-2. "those who try to be spiritual"

"Those who try to be spiritual" will fall away gradually to "seducing doctrines".

-3. "those who are spiritual"

"Those who are spiritual" will have a mighty outpouring of the Holy Spirit without regard to age, sex, or status.

Those of us who are Believers have a very good reason to view this time quite differently. Jesus' analogy of this era is that it is a time of "birth pains." This analogy, given by Jesus, changes significantly the concept of what is going to take place and gives an entirely different picture of what the end result is expected to be.

What thoughts or concerns do you have regarding this time referred to as the "beginning of birth pains?"

Read Revelation 6:1-2 and make notes:

It is worth noting that it is The Lamb who opens the first seal. Only the Lamb is worthy of setting into motion the events that will bring human history to it's conclusion. The first seal broken, a rider on a white horse is revealed, with a bow and a crown.

Bow	Power and authority
Crown	Honor and respect

In every generation of Church History, there have been those who have interpreted this rider of the horse as Christ Jesus. Many Bible commentators explain the rider of the white horse as Christ riding forth to conquer the earth as the Lord of Lords. There are at least as many who give practical arguments against this view but we will only mention the following.

The Lamb in this text is clearly and unquestionably Jesus. The Lamb is the one opening the seals. Christ is the one giving the divine permission to the riders to "go forth."

This is a leader who is not as he appears. The bow would give the impression that this is a person of authority, but upon close examination we notice they have no arrows for this bow. If this rider does not actually have authority, then the white color is probably not a true representation either. This is hypocritical, corrupt, and evil leadership. Evil never presents itself and says, "I am evil." And evil never openly confesses that if you follow me I will destroy you. Evil always tries to appear as good.

According to the numerology of the first century church era, "1" represented "unity, alone, independent."

In your opinion, is this rider of the first horse a corrupt civil leader, or a corrupt religious leader? Why?

Do you have another interpretation for the rider of the first horse? What is the basis for this interpretation?

Read Revelation 6:3-4 and make notes:

The second seal broken, a rider on a red horse is revealed, having a great sword.

This rider is bringing about a great slaughter by way of a "large sword." Peace being removed from the earth, people turn their destructive instincts toward each other. We have war. Corrupt leadership as with the rider of the first horse, will naturally lead to war. War triumphs over corrupt leadership!

According to numerology of the first century Church era, "2" represented "companionship, increased strength, added power." In your opinion, is this a representation that God will use those who are evil to bring about war and use war as a divine judgment?

Do believe another interpretation of this horse and rider to be the correct interpretation? If so, what is it and what is the basis for this interpretation?

Read Revelation 6:5-6 and make notes:

The opening of the third seal reveals a black horse, the rider carrying a balance, and a voice being heard.

After a war with much destruction, food supplies have been destroyed and the world is left with les that sanitary conditions. Disease and Famine triumph over war!
Even though this rider is given orders to go forth and bring about sickness, disease, and famine, there are limits set. They are not permitted to harm the "oil" or the "wine."
According to the numerology of the first century Church era, "3" represented "deity" and wa considered a divine number.
Does this bring to your mind any verses concerning "new wine?"
Do you think there might be a connection between this limitation of not harming the wine and that o Christ's Blood being represented as "wine" in the communion?
Is this referring to the spiritual "oil and wine" or the literal "oil and wine?"
Is this referring to the basics of everyday life being affected (wheat and barley = bread) and yet the luxuries of life not being affected (wine)?

If you believe another interpretation of this horse and rider to be correct, what is it?	What is the basis
for this interpretation?	

Read Revelation 6:7-8 and make notes:

The fourth seal reveals Death riding a pale horse with Hell following after. He is given power over a fourth of the earth.

Fourth part	Small percentage

Hell following Death is the/readiness of the grave to quickly take away those who die. Death and The Grave triumph over disease and famine!

Once again, we see that limits are set. The "fourth part" is a small number as compared to the total world population rather than a literal counting. Only a small part of the earth can be affected by Death and the Grave.

There is no indication from the scriptures that the events of these first four seals will happen to the entire world. Most evidence indicates these events occur in a small part of the world. This is the beginning of the Antichrist's efforts to take over the world. He will begin with a small part and attempt to spread from there.

We have had several areas and countries in recent years to suffer from corrupt leadership. These same countries have all had war with tremendous destruction. This is not so new from past generations in itself but there is more. These countries have been and are now experiencing food shortages. There are a couple of countries at this present time who are experiencing severe famines and plagued with deadly diseases.

Many people have died in these countries from fighting, from famine, and from disease. However, the number compared to the total world population is only a small part.

These events have all occurred predominantly in non-christian countries. This easily coincides with the first, third, and fourth seal. the opening of the second seal gives it's rider power to take peace from the earth. This sounds more universal than the opening of the other three seals.

Today, even the countries that are not in physical combat are not at peace within themselves. Practically every country in the world is at present in a state of unrest. There are many factors people can blame for this; such as inflation or some other difficulty; but never the less, peace is going from the earth as a whole.

When we see all these things coming, or at hand, we are told by our Lord not to worry or to become upset. We have not been forgotten as many will think the world is coming to it's end. It is coming to it's end but these events are not the end. Jesus said such things are not the end but only the "beginning of birth pains".

According to the numerology of the first century church era, "4" represented "the universe." It was considered the cosmic number. "4" was used to speak of the created world or the universe.

The earth, and everything on the earth, is a part of all that is "created." The "4", being a number of the "created world" would certainly apply to the earth. But, this interpretation isn't needed since the vision states this rider was given power over a fourth of "the earth." The "fourth part" is better understood to refer to the "small portion", one fourth part, as compared to the whole earth.

Do you believe another interpretation of this horse and rider to be correct. If so, what is it and what is your reason for believing it?

Revelation – Latter Times - 03
Read Revelation 6:9-11
When the fifth seal is opened, it reveals the souls of those who have been killed - for the Word of God -being consoled with white robes and told to rest but a little while.
The robes represent a position of honor and respect. The little while suggest that it will not be long until God begins to avenge the deaths of the Saints. We see in the following scriptures that truly it isn't long.
One of the oldest interpretations of the souls of the martyrs being under the altar: Their untimely death due to their obedience to God is seen by God as a sacrifice on the altar of Heaven.
This isn't out of line with some New Testament views:
Read 2 Timothy 4:6; Philippians 2:17 and make notes:
Paul viewed his coming death as an offering to be "poured out."
The cry "how long until you judge the inhabitants of the earth" is not the begging for vengeance to be carried out for their death. It is the cry of concern, because it appears that good is losing and evil is winning. "Aren't you going to do something Lord?" - "How long will evil be allowed to ravage your people Lord?"

Do you believe another interpretation of the "souls under the altar" to be correct? If so, what is it and why do you believe it to be correct?
What are some of the other interpretations you have heard concerning these "souls under the altar?"
Read Revelation 6:12-14
Read Haggai 2:6; Acts 2:20 and make notes:
This is not a new prophetic word about the coming of the "great day" of the Lord's wrath. Peter quoted the prophecy found in Joel 2:31.
The sixth seal opened, reveals a complete loss of the cosmic order. The earth shakes, the sun fails to give light, the moon dims to a bloody glow, stars fall out of the sky to the earth. It is highly unlikely that the first century readers took this passage literally. All of the events described here are parts of a well established prophetic language.

Earthquakes represented divine visitation. Read Exodus 19:18 and make notes:
Stars falling represented the end has come. Read Isaiah 34:4 and make notes:
Isaiah used this same expression when speaking of the coming of the end.
The picture of the heavens receding like a scroll probably doesn't bring the same mental picture for us today as it did the first century readers. Try to imagine a stiff papyrus scroll that had been rolled up for some time. These scrolls were not rolled completely out. After enough of the scroll is unrolled to allow reading, as more scroll is unrolled from one side, the portion that has been read is rolled onto the other side of the scroll. Imagine as the scroll is being unrolled that it should break in the middle How quickly the two parts of the scroll would roll up on either side is the picture that came to the mind of the first century readers.
For some people, the idea of such drastic events disturbs their view and concept of a loving God. In other places in the book of Revelations mankind is shown to have come to such a defiant attitude that neither demonic plague (9:20) or scorching heat is sufficient to bring them to repentance. This helps to understand why things will become so cataclysmic.
Read Revelations 6:15-17 and make notes:
Read Isaiah 2:19 and make notes:

It isn't the intent of this text to cover every possible station in society. It is pointing out those who would normally feel most secure and strong will at this time feel very much afraid. "Kings" represent those in the highest places of civil authority. "Princes" represent those in lower places of civil authority. "Generals" represent those in places of military authority. It is not a matter of financial or social position. People of every level of society and station in life will be seeking a place to hide.

Adam and Eve desired and attempted to hide from God when they realized they were guilty of sin (Gen 3:8). Those running to hide in this end time are probably running more from the presence of God than they physical calamities. A guilty conscience makes men a fugitive from God. This indicates there is clearly no place to hide from God. It is an interesting insight into the heart of man. It seems better to be crushed by a mountainous avalanche than to face the Lamb of God.

Jesus, the Lamb of Revelation, is no longer the sacrificial Lamb. His righteous wrath is the divine response of holiness to persistent unrepentant wickedness.

Read Zephaniah 1:14-18 and make notes:

Read Nahum 1:6; Malachi 3:2 and make notes:

Indeed, who can possibly stand before the Lord's wrath? Who can possibly endure such an outpouring of the Lord as a "refiner's fire" or a "launderer's soap?"

Write in this space - the person you believe can withstand such a time.

Revelation – Latter Times - 03
Is this "cosmic disorder" referring to a literal displacing or failing of the sun, earth, and stars - or is this a spiritual reference to the complete confusion that will befall those who are enemies to God and His church?
What are some of the interpretations you have heard concerning the opening of the "sixth seal?"
Read Revelation 7:1-3 and make notes:
Read Daniel 7:2; Jeremiah 49:36 and make notes:
At this point in the vision we see a tremendous act of Love on God's part. The holding of the winds represents the withholding of destruction. The errors of mankind are bringing on the greatest troubles of the ages. Before God allows this to happen, He seals and secures His living children. When God seals the living saved, he gives them immunity to all that is to befall the earth in the coming next days.
Chapter 7 reveals a distinct contrast between the security and blessed state of the faithful and the panic and distress of the unbeliever. There are two visions in chapter 7; the 144,000 who are sealed and the blessedness of the multitude before the throne.

Also in this text is the answer to the question just presented, "Who can Stand?". Those who are faithful can endure and withstand the Lord's wrath!

Read Revelation 7:4-8 and make notes:

In numerology of the first century church era, "12" is the number of organized religion. Since this "12" is identified with the names of God's people (the tribes of Israel) this is referring to God's Called Out People. In biblical numerology there are two ways to indicate or represent absolute completeness. One is to multiply the number times itself, or square the number. The second is to multiply the number times a thousand. Both of the methods of indicating absolute completeness are employed in this vision. This is like making all of the letters upper case (capitalized), using bold print, and underlining the message at the same time. The absolute completeness of this number is getting extra emphasis.

The twelve tribes of Israel listed are not the original twelve tribes. The tribe of Dan is omitted and Manasseh, a son of Joseph, is added. Jewish tradition has it that the anti-christ will come from the tribe of Dan.

In reality it is very unlikely that the exact same number would be saved from each literal tribe. Look at the meaning of each of the names listed :

The collective meaning of these names is a very good description of God's children of every nation.

The twelve thousand from each tribe goes to emphasize that all nations shall be included. Each tribe is representative of a portion of the world's people. When we accept Jesus as our personal savior, God becomes our heavenly Father, and we become spiritually a child of Israel.

One hundred forty four thousand says that an absolute completeness of all the spiritual children of Israel have been sealed. God has not overlooked anyone, not even the least heard of person. Every living saved person is sealed.

It isn't a select group of believers who are sealed. The full number of all who are saved will be sealed.

With the living saved - given immunity to the coming perils, - God can now send judgment for the souls of those killed for the Word's sake.

Do you believe another interpretation of the "144,000" to be the correct interpretation? If so, what is it and why do you believe it to be correct?"

What are some of the other interpretations you have heard concerning the "144,000" and why do you believe they are not the correct interpretation?

Read Revelation 7:9-17 and make notes:

Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Acts 14:22 and make notes:

A Time of heavenly bliss for all the saved. This great multitude which has come out of great tribulation is not on earth, but in heaven. After seeing the Saints sealed, the next sign is a great multitude standing before the throne of God. They are clothed in white with palm branches in their hands. They are of every nation, kindred, people, and tongue. They are Jew and Gentile, but they are all God's people. They are "the Church."


The palm branches had significant meaning to the first century Jewish believers. Palm branches were used in the Feast of Tabernacles as part of the victory celebration commemorating the release from Egyptian bondage. These Believers are in a state of release and are celebrating victoriously.

What are some of the interpretations you have heard concerning this "great multitude" before the throne?

Many believe this multitude, which is too large to be counted, is the same group previously referred to as the 144,000. In the first part of this vision, the emphasis and the message was the completeness of the sealing and the preserving. In the second part of this vision, the message is on the future state of the saints. This assurance of the outcome will be a help to those believers seeing signs of the end destruction coming. Also look at the exciting promise found in verses 15-16. They will not suffer from excessive heat, they will be provided springs of "living water", and God will take away their tears. They will no longer have any reason to cry.

In numerology of the first century Church era, "7" represented "completeness." In verses 11-12, we see the angels praising God in a 7 fold doxology. This is speaking of complete praise (number 7). Luke 15:10 tells us of the joy before the angels of God over one sinner who repents. Can you imagine the level of rejoicing the angels shall have when all of the saints stand in glorified bodies around the throne of God?

Verse 13-14 asks the question, "Who are these?" And then the answer is given; "They are those who came out of the great tribulation." The word "the" is believed by some to indicate this is not referring to just a time of tribulation, but to the tribulation in the series of events at the end of time. Since "the" great tribulation has not yet been revealed in this vision, the better interpretation is this is probably the tribulation that Christ said every Believer would have to endure from the world because of their faith.



One of the Elders explains that they are those who came out of great tribulation and have washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb. This is not "the Great Tribulation" as this has not occurred at this point in the vision. The agrist tense of the Greek verbs are used in the "washed their robes" and "made them white." This speaks of a "once for all" action.

An impressive paradox – wash a robe in red blood and it becomes "white." The work of receiving a robe of righteousness is not one of merit but one of submitting to the sacrifice of the Lamb. The white (pure) robe is what makes it possible to stand among the multitude around the throne. A life of faith makes it possible to have a white robe.

This is the collection of all the Saints who have died to this point in time. Now that God has sealed and immunized the living Saved, he can begin to avenge for the blood of the Saints. God calls all the sleeping Saved to rise and witness the last effort to get men saved and the avenging of their death.

Everyone who enters Heaven from earth will do so through many or great tribulations. Those who are asleep will rise first. Now that they have risen we can watch for the Rapture at any literal moment.

If you believe another interpretation of this "great multitude" to be the correct interpretation, give the reason you believe this to be true.

Write your thoughts and questions regarding this study to share with the group:	

Revelation Latter Times - 04
Read Revelation 8:1-2 and make notes:
As soon as the seventh seal is opened, a deafening silence blankets all of creation. God says nothing. The Lamb says nothing. None of the heavenly creatures say anything. One can envision nothing moves during this time of silent suspense. This is a moment of silence in reverence to the solemn events about to occur.
This concept of reverent suspenseful silence when God arises, or his judgment appears, is one with a long history and was well established in the hearts and minds of the early church.
Read Habakkuk 2:20 and make notes:
The mere presence of God or the presence of God's judgment calls for utter silence of all others.
Read Zechariah 2:13 and make notes:
"All mankind"; everyone in every place is exhorted to be still before the Lord. It would appear as a threatening gesture for God to rouse himself up from his holy dwelling place.
Read Amos 5:13 and make notes:

Amos was a prophet that would not have condemned protest. When the prophet Amos made this statement it was following a lists of judgments brought on by the people's many sins. The prudent man realizes at such a time as this anything he might say would only make things worse.

These angels are not the archangels. They are not the seven spirits of God. And they are not selected from among the great number of angels in heaven. These were seven specific angels as pointed out by the phrase "the" seven angels.

God has always been long-suffering and here He still is the same. In the span of time in which it takes for the first six trumpets to sound, God sends men just a taste of the tribulation and allows them time to repent and be saved.


This era of time in which the first six trumpets sound is referred to as the Beginning of Tribulation". People can be saved during this time as evidenced by the statement that men repented not. It does not say that they "could not", but that they "would not."


During the time that will follow this on we will call the "Great Tribulation" no one can be saved.

The sounding of the first six trumpets, is the last effort of God to bring men to accept Jesus and worship the true God.

Share any other interpretations you have heard concerning this passage.

When the seventh seal is opened and everything falls silent, what is your thought or concept of why the silence?





Enoch was a man who "walked with God." Jude is quoting from a writing attributed to Enoch but not considered part of the Holy Word of God. Many people want to discard this text since it is a quotation from a book outside the Scripture. If we accept Jude as being inspired by the Holy Spirit in writing the book of Jude, then we must accept this statement as true. Notice the stressing of "all the ungodly." This appears to be a good summary statement of God's universal divine judgment.

Read Acts 17:31 and make notes:

It is clearly established in the Scriptures that God does not want anyone to perish; but would rather have every person to be saved. He even allows ample time for repentance to be made. But this text is pointing to the climax of the continuously unfolding plan of redemption. Jesus will cease to be the sacrificial lamb and will become the judge of the whole world.

Can you remember any Scriptures that support the idea that God doesn't want anyone to perish? Write them here and be prepared to share them with the Home Group. If you can't remember chapter and verse, at least write enough of the Scripture that others will recognize it.

This picture is consistent with God previous visitations in judgment and predictions of God's judgment.

Read Isaiah 28:2; Ezekiel 13:11; Exodus 9:23-24 and make notes:

At the time of God's judgment upon Egypt, God made a spectacular display of it's arrival. Plants, animals, and people were all damaged by the hail of the judgment.

Read Joshua 10:11 and make notes:

What Israel's army had accomplished was small in comparison to what God did with hail. Nothing of man can withstand or compare to God's judgment.

We have an almost unimaginable storm of God's judgment, which will cause approximately one third of all vegetation to be destroyed. There are many who teach the judgments of the trumpets will not be literal events but symbolic. If we accept the ten plagues of Egypt as historical and literal, then there is no justifiable reason not to accept these events as literal also. Admittedly, it is extremely difficult to identify at this time the exact form these literal events will take, but they will come to pass.

What do you think God is trying to do with this first trumpet judgment? Why destroy one third of the earth, one third of the trees, and all of the grass?

Read Revelation 8:8-9 and make notes:

The second trumpet brings about something like a great mountain burning with fire cast into the sea.

There are those who teach the "sea" symbolizes all the people of earth. For them, the mountain symbolizes one large nation ablaze with perhaps a revolution. Their interpretation is this revolution spills over into the rest of the world causing great destruction; much like a world war. The problem with this interpretation is the reference to the "ships" destroyed.

This is possibly a violent volcanic eruption which cast so much burning lava and ash into the ocean that severe heat pollution results. Approximately one third of all sea life is killed. Many ships of the sea are destroyed, probably by several severe tidal waves (don't overlook spiritual application)

Read Exodus 7:20-21; Psalms 105:29 and make notes:


Whether the river became literal blood or the color of blood is hardly worth arguing. In another passage in Revelation, the moon is said to turn to blood. The point is simply that this is not a new type of event in the judgment of God. To the Egyptians, the Nile was sacred. Their judgment fell upon that which was held in highest esteem.

Read Hosea 4:1-3 and make notes:

Verse 1, in this text from Hosea, lists three general things missing from the community of God's people that caused God's judgment to fall; (1) no faithfulness, (2) no love, (3) no acknowledgment of God. When God's people can not be counted upon (unfaithful), fail to show kindness toward one another (no love), and do not acknowledge God; it will result in God's judgment falling upon the people.

Verse 2 lists specific sins committed that fall into the three general areas listed in verse 1. Verse 3 clearly states it is the sins of man that cause the fields, birds, animals, and sea life to waste away. The sins of man bring death not only upon man, but upon the earth over which man was given to govern and care for.

What is the purpose God is trying to accomplish with the judgment of this second trumpet?



Worship of other gods produces bitter poison. The instruction was to "make sure" no individual or no group of persons turns their heart from God. The result of people turning their hearts from God is the release (or production) of bitter poison.

What is the purpose of this third trumpet judgment? Is there a message in it?

Read Revelation 8:12 and make notes:

The fourth trumpet sounds with universal results. There is a cosmic disorientation with the sun showing approximately one third less light upon earth. The moon and stars likewise according to their relationship with the sun. We now have days with about one third less daylight time.

The absence of any instrument by which this judgment came about is worth noting. In many of the previous judgments, it is our natural tendency to make a great deal of the instrument of the judgment. This judgment coming to pass without an instrument is enlightening. We can spend so much of our attention and resources on the instrument that we miss the more important message of the judgment. We should focus on the judgment and it's message rather than on the instrument of judgment.

One of the most popular interpretations of this text sees the sun as representing the highest authority, the moon representing an authority derived from the higher, and the stars as more subordinate authorities. Some who hold this interpretation believe this applies to the earthly authorities that were in John's day. Others apply it to other earthly authorities who would come later. Still others apply it to some earthly authorities yet to come.

The last sentence of this verse stands as a very strong argument against this interpretation. The clear reference to "day" and "night" insists that we look at a more literal interpretation.

Read Joel 2:10; Amos 8:9; Exodus 10:21-23; Luke 21:25-28

What man could even hope to harness or control the sun? And yet, God is able to darken the sun or cause it to go down before it's appointed time. We may be awestruck by the immense power of the sun, but it is important to remember God controls the awesome power of the sun.

Do you believer this refers to a literal changing of the sun's brightness or the length of day time hours? If so, which one?
What do you think God may use to accomplish this?
If the length of daylight or the brightness of the sun changes, do you think you could use this to explain to people why they need to establish a personal relationship with God?
Read Revelation 8:13 and make notes:
In verse 13, The KJV bible and some other translations have the word "angel." The oldest and most reliable manuscripts do not have the Greek word for "angel" but instead have the word for "eagle." The eagle is a symbol of that which is swift and unerring in regard to sweeping up its intended prey. The eagle is the image and meaning opposite of the dove.

The eagle represents the swiftness and certainty of the woes that are about to come to pass. This eagle is in midair where it would be visible to the greatest number of people. It's proclamation of "woe" is specifically for the people on the "earth." He cries Woe, Woe, Woe; one woe for each trumpet yet to sound.





Things can look severe enough at this point. The cry of an eagle regarding the trumpets yet to come, and the fact that the time is taken to pronounce "woe, woe, woe" indicates it will be significantly more severe. The previous judgments have fallen upon the earth proper. Now the judgments are about to begin falling upon the people of the earth.



Do you think this will be a literal "eagle" that speaks or is this representing someone or something?



These locusts that come up out of the "shaft of the Abyss": Do you think these are literal locust or demons? Why?
Read Revelation 9:7-12 and make notes:
The angel of the Abyss is not Satan. He is more likely to be one of the chief evil angels who serve under Satan and has been given charge of the Abyss and it's demons. His name in Hebrew is "Abaddon" which means "destruction." His name in Greek is "Apollyon" which means "to destroy."
These locust will be abnormally large and will have tails that cause physical pain. They will be so

These locust will be abnormally large and will have tails that cause physical pain. They will be so large that they will resemble horses in shape and their heads will appear as having crowns. Their large size will make their faces resemble those of human faces. They will have hair and sharp teeth to look terrifying more than to bite. The neck and chest of these locust will be extra thick as though shielded. They will be so big and so many in number that they will create a loud noise in flight.

Some observations concerning these locust:

- .1 like horses prepared for battle positioned and ready
- .2 like heads crowned with gold have authority to inflict
- .3 like the faces of men determination and intelligent look to men
- .4 like the hair of women can be attractive to men
- .5 like the teeth of lions can appear fierce and cruel
- .6 like iron breast plates people appear helpless against them
- .7 like chariots rushing into battle overwhelming
- .8 like scorpion tails torture

For those who feel this is a literal locust, the interpretation is something like the following: God could easily create a special locust for this plague. He probably will use the earlier events to result in abnormal insects such as these. Maybe excessive radiation of several types cause a mutation in the insect world, or maybe God will create them at this moment. Whichever the case it may be, they come now.

Another interpretation of this passage is to understand this is still imagery. These locust are symbols of destruction. The fact that they arise from the center of the earth through a hole represents the rising of demonic forces. Real locust would attack vegetation. These locust are seen attacking human beings.

This could be imagery of a savage army attack. The question to this interpretation would center around this army not harming those would are sealed by God in the various parts of the world.

There are those who interpret these locust and their torment to historical groups that have existed. There are significant parallels between the early reign of Mohammedism and this text. Similar parallels have been made with other historical groups. The problem with this interpretation lies in the timing of this event. This text clearly says this occurs after the sealing of the saints. Unless you put all, or most, of these texts from Revelation in the past, then this interpretation cannot be correct.

Since the locust comes from the "Abyss" and this is the place where demons, or fallen angels, are kept locked up; these locust are best interpreted as demons.

Their sting will last five months and will be so torturous that men will try to kill themselves but will fail in all their attempts to commit suicide. If their sting killed, it would seem a merciful thing.

The moral consequences of evil bring people to despair, they have no means of bearing the pain, and sincerely seek to see their painful life come to an end. Evil is a terrible task master, and eventually destroys a person's desire and will to live.

The smoke is only to serve as a camouflage for the locust until they are suddenly upon the people of the earth.

Read Exodus 10:13; Joel 1:4 and make notes:

Locust has long been established as representing judgment from God. Remembering this is a judgment from God; even though these creatures may be a mutant form of some previously existing creature; even if the demons are using something made by man; it is important not to overlook this is a judgment on man being directed by God.


God loves us deeply and does not want us to suffer. This is why he warns us of the coming judgments. He desires for us to escape the pain and destruction.

Read Jeremiah 11:11; Hebrews 2:3 and make notes:

The way of escape is to make sure that we DO NOT ignore the "great salvation" that has been provided to us.

One of the glorious mysteries is these locust will not inflict anyone who has been sealed of God! The rottenness of the world which has come from an inner decay is a clear picture in this part of the vision. While the persecuting world is being showered with these painful judgments, no harm is befalling those who have the seal of God upon them. The fact that these locust cannot harm those who are sealed of God helps us to understand this is "after" the sealing of the saints. These events are still being seen and recorded in a sequential manner (one after the other).

What are some of the things you have been taught concerning these locust that sting people and cause pain?



three times, for emphasis and clarity. One of the strongest arguments against this interpretation is in this text. The mission and purpose of these four angels in this sixth trumpet are distinctly different

from the four angels in the sixth seal.

Many interpret the river Euphrates and the army literally. For those who hold to a literal interpretation, we have weapons today that move across country and fire in both directions. The literal place of the "forces" is the area and region of the Euphrates. The army is that of a human army.

Others interpret the river Euphrates as symbolic of the chastisement of God's people. Most of Israel's chastisements came from the Euphrates region. Many of the ancients were of the opinion that the anti-christ would come from the Euphrates area. These interpreters usually see the army as demonic forces rather than a literal human army.

Another way to interpret this text is both literal and figurative. The river Euphrates can be the literal location and the army can be figurative. The army can be made up of literal human forces and demonic forces if this is the army of the anti-christ.

Read Psalms 80:8-11 and make notes:

In this Scripture, Egypt is taken as literal, while the vine, boughs, and shoots are all taken to be figurative by almost all Bible scholars. It would not be out of character for good Bible interpretation to do so for this text in Revelation as well. Just a note, the river mentioned in this text from the Psalms is the river Euphrates.

"I heard their number." Two hundred million horse soldiers represents a very large army. Horses, in the prophetic, indicate strength. This enemy is a very large and formidable collection of those drawn up to bring about destruction. It is interesting that more attention is given to the horses in this part of the vision than to the riders on the horses.

The number of the army is interpreted by some as a literal count and by others as a figuratively large, maybe even uncountable, army. Since this number is only of the "mounted troops," we have no indication of the size of the army as a whole. In those days, there were normally many more foot soldiers than mounted troops.

The number is two times the number "ten thousand" multiplied by itself. According to numerology of the first century church era, one way to indicate absolute completeness was to multiply a number times itself. Another way to indicate absolute completeness was to multiply a number times one thousand.

Also, according to the numerology of that era, "ten" is the number of human beings. The number of human beings (10), multiplied by one thousand, and then multiplied by itself would emphasize the absolute completeness of human beings; times two. It is strongly emphasized. This may lead us toward seeing this army as human beings. But the intended victims of this army is the people of the earth. The absolute completeness of human beings cannot refer to the army consisting of all the people of the earth. If this is absolute completeness of human beings as it relates to this army, then it is that no one on earth will be overlooked.

Notice in these plagues of destruction that God always spared more than he allowed to be destroyed. In every case he spared approximately two thirds while only allowing one third to be destroyed. God does not delight in the destruction of the wicked.

Verse 20 is very important to understanding all that is taking place in this vision and the message weaved within this vision. Those that were not killed by the plague of this trumpet, "did not repent." It does not say these people "could not" repent, but that they did not repent. The obvious meaning is that these people could have repented but they chose not to repent.

All of God's judgments are remedial in purpose. The judgments that come into the life of a person or people as the consequences of their sin is a way of saying, "don't do this; turn back to God's way."

Do you think this army consists of human soldiers or demons? Why?

The number of 200 million mounted troops: - Is it a literal count or is this a figurative count? If literal, how many other soldiers (not mounted) do you think is likely to be part of this army?

Read	Revelation 10:1-4	and make notes:		

"Seal up what the seven thunders have said." These thunders are representative of the wrath of God. God's judgments are so powerful and frightening that they can only be revealed in symbol form. Some of them cannot be explained or understood. But, if these particular judgments were not understandable it would not be necessary to "seal them up." John must have been able to understand them and it must be that others could understand them should they hear them or read them. They are understandable, and because God did not wish us to hear them or read them, he commanded that they be "sealed."

All during the judgments represented by the first 6 trumpets men refused to repent. There is no recourse for God at this point but to bring retribution to the unrepentant people. We cannot separate God's mercy from God's judgment. Neither can we separate God's love from God's wrath. These are simply two responses on our part to the One God. God is making an effort to share His divine life with His created beings. When we respond positively to God's offer, the result is salvation, deliverance, protection, and blessing. When we respond negatively to God's offer, the result is judgment and wrath.

People sometimes create a dilemma for themselves. They try to create a changing God who is at one time happy with them and blessing them; and at another time angry with them and punishing them. They try to create a God who loves them one moment and then later hates them.

Read Malachi 3:6 and make notes:

God never changes. He is always the same. God does not love us at one time and hate us at another. God always love us. God always responds out of divine love for us. This divine love dictates that we receive judgment for our actions. When we are obedient, the judgment is blessing; and when we are disobedient, the judgment is wrath. We change! God does not change. God's response is always the same!

Read Ezekiel 1:28 and make notes:

A messenger came "from" heaven:

- .clothed with a cloud symbol of majestic, heavenly appearance
- .rainbow in hand symbol of glory and mercy of God
- .face shines like sun symbol that message is of enormous splendor
- .feet like pillars of fire symbol of holiness, purity, & righteousness
- .one foot on sea, one foot on land –

massive size and power of messenger – laying claim to all the earth – land and sea.



There are some who believe this messenger is Christ. They usually refer to the phrase "my witnesses" in Rev 11:3 as a basis for this belief. Throughout the Bible angels spoke for God and so this would not be unusual language for an angel who is on an assignment from God. The language of the oath that is spoken next, stands as an equal evidence against this being Christ. Verse 1 says clearly this was "another mighty angel." There is no justifiable reason to change this from an angel to anyone or anything else.



There are those who believe the purpose for measuring the temple is for judgment. Why would the Gentile court not be measured for judgment and only the Jewish court?

Some believe the measuring of the temple means the Jews and the temple will be marked and spared from the attacks of the Antichrist. This interpretation is difficult to reconcile with 2 Thessalonians 2:4 where the Antichrist is predicted to enter the temple.


Some believe the temple is symbolism referring to the temple made of living stones, consisting of all believers. This interpretation is difficult to reconcile the measuring of the Jew but not the Gentile portion of the temple.

Some believe the measuring indicated the number of the Jews who will be saved can be measured but too many Gentiles will be saved to count. This appears to be a tremendous stretching of the Scripture to come to this interpretation. Since nothing more is said regarding the measuring of the temple, we simply do not have enough evidence to come to a satisfactory conclusion regarding the measuring of the temple and the things within it.

What is the best interpretation of "measuring the temple?"

We find metaphors mixed throughout the book of Revelations. For example, the Lamb standing up, and yet the Lamb is dead or slain. The holy city and the temple are used interchangeably, both referring to the church. If the "temple" being measured is the whole church, then it is those who are unbelievers who are not counted.

It is not uncommon for Bible prophets to use symbolic actions to dramatize predicted events. Isaiah walked naked and bare foot to symbolize the coming Egyptian captivity by the Assyrians (Isaiah 20). Ezekiel dug through the wall and carried his luggage through the hole to symbolize the coming exile (Ezekiel 12). Agabus bound his hands and feet to indicate what was going to happen to Paul (Acts 21).




In the middle of the week could easily match the 3 ½ spoken of in Revelation since this is the middle of seven. It at least matches the "time, times, and half a time" recorded in Daniel 7:25 above. Daniel was referring to the last week of his seventy weeks. Christ, in Matthew 24, says he is referring to Daniel's weeks. Daniel says the beginning of his second half of that last week is the abomination of desolation – "abominable idols." Christ elaborated on Daniel's seventieth week. Christ called this time the "beginning of birth pains."

Read 2 Thessalonians 2:3-4 and make notes:

There will come a time - when the Antichrist will stand in the holy place. The Antichrist apparently will sit/stand in the "holy place", or the temple of God, and declare that he is able and willing to meet the needs of the world's people.


According to numerology of the first century church era, three and one half would represent an indefinite number. To declare something as lasting three and one half years would be saying it would last an undetermined, or indefinite, time. No one knows how long it will be. If the message is hidden within the meaning of the numerology of that day, then the time of the two witnesses would be an indefinite time period. The time of the temple being trampled would be an indefinite time period.

There is a large number of people who take this time period to be a literal count of time. For some this time period is not a literal time but simply a symbolic length of time – "the time of the Gentiles." Others believe it refers to a time when each day represents one year, thus giving 1,260 years. The problem with this interpretation is in finding a majority of those who hold this position to agree on when this 1,260 years begins.






The Two Witnesses Have Great Power.





This reveals the enormous power and control the Antichrist will have. Can you imagine the world allowing the leader from any nation today getting away with killing one of the now known international spiritual leaders and leaving their dead body in the street for days? No doubt many national leaders would speak out against such an atrocity and some type of international action would be taken against the nation that did such a thing. And yet this passage tells us the Antichrist will have support from all over the world for this hideous act.

The great city where these two witnesses are killed and allowed to lie in the streets is called spiritual Sodom and Egypt. A place embracing and promoting immorality like Sodom and a place that abused and killed God's chosen people like Egypt. "Great" city seems to be emphasizing the level of wickedness of this city.

When we think back over human history at those who have massacred millions of people, it is sickening. The likes of Nero, Hitler, Stalin, and come contemporary dictators who have killed people simply because of their genealogy is just a glimpse of the nature of the Antichrist (beast). Picture, if you can, someone like these who does in fact have control over the whole earth. The millions killed would certainly become tens of millions slaughtered.

Consider their dead bodies being allowed to lie in the streets for 3 ½ days. If the days represented years, this would indeed be remarkable regarding their dead bodies. Would not these bodies decay in 3 ½ years? It is probably best to interpret this text as speaking of a literal 3 ½ days as the span of time. This remains most consistent with the interpreting of the rest of the book of Revelations.

Who is the Antichrist – The Beast?

The Two Witnesses Are Resurrected.

Read Revelation 11:11-12 and make notes:

When the three and one half days are ended, the two prophets will miraculously return to life. The world will witness this miracle. Then the two will ascend up into Heaven before the eyes of the world. They will go before the throne of God to bear witness.

Taking a human life is the action of last resort, or the maximum punishment man can extend toward another man. How helpless we would feel against those who are resurrected! What could we do to those who will not remain dead? Are we to keep killing them over and over? We realize we are destined to be defeated by those we cannot permanently kill!

The resurrection of God's witnesses is a solid statement that God holds the ultimate authority over life AND death!

The two witnesses are resurrected and taken to heaven. Can the whole world witness their return to life? By means such as television and satellites, yes they can! Actually, the Scripture doesn't tell us how many witness their resurrection or their being taken to heaven. If they have been televised for three days lying in the street, the whole world could see it happen. But it's just as likely for it to have become "old news" after 3 days and few would be watching even if it was still being televised.

However many or few did observe this great miracle, and however many only heard about it, there was an immediate effect. Can you imagine the great fear that would begin to swell up when the witnesses come back to life? Especially for those who had rejoiced at their death and had celebrated their dead bodies being allowed to lie out in the open street instead of being buried?

The Two Witnesses Are Vindicated.

Read Revelation 11:13-14 and make notes:

The earthquake, that signaled their resurrection, killed 7,000 people. An interesting statement is found in this text; "the survivors gave glory to God!" Does this mean they were saved?

Is the 7,000 people a tenth of the population of that city?


The three years of their ministry is but a shadow of the ministry of Jesus. The remaining one half year will be that of the beast making war against and overcoming them. Their three and one half days of death in open public will be their testimony before the throne of God to bring righteous judgment upon their murderers.

The world had in a very real sense deified evil in the killing and in the rejoicing over the death of God's witnesses. This is very close to the unpardonable sin. The death of God's servants, or martyrs, did not cause the people of the world to turn to God. But the resurrection of God's servants did cause some of the people of the world to give God glory.

God has now released two of the final three Woes of which the angel earlier had announced - and now it is time for the final Woe.

Read Luke 1:37 and make notes:

Read Revelation 4:11 and make notes:


Read Hebrews 7:3 and make notes:

Read Revelation 11:18 and make notes:
The declaration in this verse is of no small consequence. The time has come for "judging the dead," and for "rewarding your servants," and for "destroying those who destroy the earth." The time has come for "judging," "rewarding," and "destroying."
Verse 18 clarifies the decisive nature of the sounding of the seventh trumpet. It is interesting that a time of rewarding "your servants the prophets" is declared but it also says "and your saints." Surely, if the text stated "reward your saints" this would be all inclusive of every believer. While every believer is not a prophet, every prophet (of God) is a saint. There must be a reason why God specified a time of reward for "the prophets" and a time of reward for "saints."
Could it be that the "prophets" will be judged by a higher standard of obedience than the "saints" at large?
Could it be that while the prophets may have accomplished greater works than the average saint, their level of obedience would be the same?

Is the reward of the prophet going to be greater than the reward of the saint?
Is it that the reward of the prophet will not be greater than the reward of the average saint, since the only did what they were asked to do?
Read Matthew 10:41 and make notes:
What do you think is the "prophet's reward" as compared to the "righteous man's reward?"
Read John 3:36; Romans 1:18; Ephesians 5:6; Hebrews 9:27; Matthew 25:31-32; 2 Peter 2:9; 2 Peter 3:7 and make notes:



Some important notes:

- .1 don't join a person who rebels against God
- .2 God's wrath is going to fall on those who rebel
- .3 Everyone, including those who have died, will face God
- .4 everyone will be rewarded according to their obedience or rebellion

How should this knowledge of the coming judgment affect our attitude and lifestyle? (fear, reverence, etc.)

Read Revelation 11:19 and make notes:

When God's temple is opened, it reveals the ark of the covenant is located inside. The ark of the covenant was located inside the Holy of Holies. This was the inside of the inside of the tabernacle. No ordinary person was ever allowed to enter into this Holy of Holies. The ark of the covenant was kept out of the sight of ordinary people. Even the High Priest was allowed only one day each year to enter into it's presence. That was on the Day of Atonement.

This text reveals there will come a time when God's Glory will be revealed to all of God's people. His temple will be "opened" and all of His people can come into the presence of the ark of the covenant. Another way of saying this is that the full glory of God will come upon man.

The ark of the covenant was originally a sign and a symbol of God's covenant with His people, the Israelites. God's covenant today is in Jesus Christ and with all who accept Jesus as their Savior. This includes every nation, every tribe, every person, who believes. This symbolism helps to remind us that God has not forgotten, and does not forget, His original covenant and promises. Regardless of the destruction, the terror, and whatever else may come, God will not break His covenant with His people. The symbol of His original covenant is still with Him and He will make it visible and available to all His people.

What can you identify as something worthwhile you received from this lesson?
Write your thoughts and questions regarding this study to share with the group:

Chapter twelve is a major turning point in the Revelation. Up to this point the vision has been a series of sequential events for the most part. Before the seven last plagues are unleashed upon mankind, time and attention is turned toward giving an understanding of the underlying cause for what is about to happen.

Read John 15:20 and make notes:

Jesus warned during his earthly ministry that his followers would be persecuted in much the same manner as he was persecuted.

The stage is presented for the final conflict between good and evil. Some have pointed to the pagan religions of the world which have a very similar parallel account to the vision of the woman and dragon. They usually claim this is evidence John simply borrowed current cultural legends to write this portion of Revelation. Similar legends can be found in Greek mythology of the goddess Leto and the dragon Python; Egyptian mythology of Horus and the red dragon Set-Typhon; Babylonian mythology of Marduk and the monster Tiamat.

These similar and seemingly parallel accounts in pagan religions do not give evidence that John copied from them. It could be that the God who does not desire for any to perish could have given this same message to many peoples. Since this part of the vision is for the purpose of helping mankind to understand the reason behind these coming events, it is entirely reasonable that our merciful and gracious God communicated this message to many people, each in their own way. The message is what is important, not the specific images.

The conflict portrayed in this part of the vision is between the powers of heaven and hell rather than a specific individual and evil oppressors.

Read Revelation 12:1-2 and make notes:

The great drama begins to unfold with a great marvel being displayed in the sky. There appears a woman arrayed with the sun, crowned with twelve stars, and standing upon the moon.


Read Luke 21:11; Luke 21:25; Acts 2:19 and make notes:

The word "sign" is used in this text from Revelation in much the same way as it is used in these other N.T. passages. It is referring to a great spectacle. In other places in Revelation this word is used of the deceptive miracles of Satan. Also the fact that this is called "a sign" tells us we must interpret this as symbolic and not literally. This is called a "great" sign because of it's importance or significance.

Read Galatians 4:26 and make notes:

There are those who suggest this woman is Mary, the mother of Jesus. There are too many supernatural things about this woman for it to be Mary. Others believe the woman is the Church. The problem with this interpretation is the Church did not give birth to Christ but Christ gave birth to the Church. Still others see this woman as the people of Israel, or the Old Testament covenant community. The problem with this interpretation is following the appearance of Christ the emphasis moves to the Church.

The woman in this verse is not Mary, the mother of Jesus. This woman is the covenant community of God's people, or we might say the ideal Israel. In a number of Scriptures, the concept of Zion as the mother of the people of God is a common theme. It was always the concept that the Messiah would come out of faithful Israel. In the same chapter of this vision, the woman represents the covenant community of Old Testament Israel and the New Testament Church. The people of God have remained one throughout all parts of redemptive history.



The seven heads have been interpreted by some as the "seven deadly sins." Others interpret them as the seven evil spirits. Still others have tried to make it indicate the lack of unity in Satan's power (multiple heads).

The seven heads could be a symbol of completeness rather than a literal number of heads. This speaks of the universal power the dragon has over the earth. It could be a symbol of the completeness of his cunning and evil wisdom.

What message do you believe God is trying to communicate to us in this text of the dragon?

Read Revelation 12:4 and make notes:

The next scene in this drama reveals the dragon gathering a third of the stars and throwing them down to earth. There are a number of different interpretations of this scene. But one thing that would apply across the board is this cataclysmic event shows the tremendous power the dragon possesses. The casting down of a third of the stars probably signifies a great number rather than a literal count.

Read Jeremiah 51:34 and make notes:

Then we see the dragon standing ready to devour the child as soon as the woman gives birth. What a clear picture of the violent antagonism Satan has toward God's covenant community!

There are those who believe Satan has not yet been cast down to earth. They use this passage to support the idea that his casting down is in the future. Another passage frequently used to support this position is found in chapter one of the book of Job where it says Satan came before God to give an account of himself. This text doesn't say specifically that Satan was still in heaven. It only says he, along with all the angels, came to present themselves before God. This may or may not have been in heaven. Even if it was "in heaven," this might only mean that he had access into heavenly places as God permitted. The rest of the book of Job clearly indicates God's limiting Satan as to what he can and cannot do. If he is not yet cast down to earth, it is very difficult to explain his evil influence in the Garden of Eden.

The Bible is filled with episode after episode of Satan trying to destroy the offspring of the woman such as:

.Cain led to kill Abel Genesis 4

.Esau led to kill Jacob Genesis 27

.Pharoah led to kill Israelite children Exodus 1

.David's children led to kill each other and him 2 Samuel 13

.Jehoram led to kill his brothers 2 Chronicles 21

.attempt to kill all of Ahaziah's sons 2 Kings 8

.attempt to kill all Jews Esther


.Herod led to kill all Jewish male babies Matthew 2



What is the best interpretation of Revelation 12:4?

Read Revelation 12:5 and make notes:





This verse is not emphasizing wilderness as a time and place of hardship. It is reassuring God's people as they face what appears to be extreme hardship, or even martyrdom, that God has prepared a place of spiritual refuge for them.

The time of 1,260 days speaks of a long but undetermined amount of time rather than a literal counting of days. This is $3\frac{1}{2}$ years - and $3\frac{1}{2}$ is incomplete number being only $\frac{1}{2}$ of seven. This time, times, and $\frac{1}{2}$ time is that time span between the first and second coming of Christ.

What is your interpretation of Revelation 12:6?

Write your thoughts	and questions	regarding this	study to share	with the group:

Read Revelation 12:7 and make notes:

A great spiritual curtain has been pulled back allowing us to see the monumental battle that has been going on that is behind all the evil and ungodliness that is upon this earth. It has shown us how that great dragon, the devil, is determined to do all that he can to hurt the very heart of God.

Satan and his evil angels struggle against Michael and the angels of heaven.

Read Luke 10:18 and make notes:

Jesus had previously testified to having seen Satan fall from heaven. Some believe Jesus was speaking prophetically about a future event and others believe Jesus was speaking of an event that had already taken place.

There will be a great battle here on earth. However, the greatest and most important battle is the one which takes place in the spiritual realm. There are a number of horrible holocaust events that are recorded in history. These will all pale in comparison to the enormous holocaust that will be unleashed in this last time. This text in Revelations shows us clearly what is behind this holocaust that is launched by the Antichrist.

Who was Michael?

Read Daniel 10:13; Daniel 10:21; Daniel 12:1; Jude 1:9 and make notes:

Michael is presented as the prince as well as the guardian of God's people. He is the one who "disputed" with the devil over the body of Moses. In the Angelic realm, it would appear that Michael is the main opposition to the devil.

Many people have a mental concept of a continuous battle between good and evil. If this is true, would the contestants be Jesus and Satan or would they be Michael and Satan? And why do you think your answer is correct?

Read Revelation 12:8 make notes:

Some refer to this as a description of Satan's original expulsion from heaven. This is not likely to be the original incident of pride which caused Satan to be removed from his position in heaven.

Others apply this text to Christ's victory on the cross. The wording of this text does not support this interpretation. It is Michael, the arch angel, rather than Jesus who battles Satan.

Taking the text at face value indicates a time after Satan's removal from heaven when he returned to fight his way back in. This may have in fact been immediately following his removal but the description doesn't fit the original incident.

Satan and his evil angels will attempt to do in this last time what they have always been trying to do; destroy Israel, or the people of God. Satan, in recognizing that God is about to end all human history, will hold back nothing at in trying to literally destroy every believer. Satan's attitude appears to be that everyone he can kill will not be able to accept the saving Grace of God. This in turn adds to the hurt of God's heart. It doesn't appear that Satan has anything directly against human beings, it is that human beings mean so very much to God. Satan seems to have God's heart as his main object of pain.

It is important for us to see the glorious outcome of this battle. Satan and his evil angels will be DEFEATED!

These Scriptures are believed by many to indicate Satan has access to heaven during the time of man's history. Whether you are one of those who believes Satan has had access to heaven during man's history or not, one thing becomes clear with this text. From the time Satan and his angels lose this battle, they will never have access to heaven again. Satan will never again be able to accuse the people of God.

This will be the final battle between good and evil. This battle will be Satan's final defeat. No more chances. No rematch. No appeal. No "Do Over".

Satan lost and any hope of returning to heaven is forever lost, "they lost their place in heaven." This failed attempt explains the intense hostile attitude of Satan toward God's people.

The spiritual Israel, all believers in Jesus Christ, will be suffering the most horrible evil that has ever been unleashed upon the earth. The holocaust of the Antichrist will perhaps be as terrible as all the historical holocaust added together. Satan will be doing everything that he can do to eliminate every believer from the earth.

What insight has this brought to you regarding why the events recorded in Revelations will come to pass?

Read Revelation 12:9 and make notes:

Satan is called "the great dragon that old serpent." This could be a reference to Genesis 3:1.
Who Was Satan Originally?
Read Ezekiel 28:11-15; Isaiah 14:12 and make notes:
In the KJV this is translated "Lucifer" which means "light bearer"; while in the RSV it is "Daystar." Satan was not always the enemy of God and man. Satan's original state was that of a beautiful angel who shined like the morning star. He was the "model of perfection perfect in beauty." He was adorned with every precious stone. He was anointed and ordained by God to be a "guardian cherub."
Satan Became
Read 1 Timothy 3:6 and make notes:
Lucifer became conceited, begin to act and move in an attitude of pride, and fell under judgment.
Read 2 Corinthians 11:13 and make notes:
He was originally an angel of light and he continues to pretend to be one. Those who serve him are transformed to appear as "ministers of righteousness."

Read 2 Corinthians 4:4 and make notes:

Blinding the mind speaks of deceiving someone. That beautiful model of perfection, called Lucifer, became conceited and filled with pride. This led to his being judged and being cast out of his original place in heaven. In his fallen state, he became a "masquerader" and one who deceives others.

Can you find any reasonable logic for Satan to attack God's people with such determination when he was once the most anointed guardian cherub? And what message does this give to us as human beings?

Satan is from a Hebrew word which means "adversary." Devil is from a Greek word which means "slanderer."

Revelations 12:9 tells us the "great dragon" is the "ancient serpent" who is called the "devil" or "Satan." In the book of Revelation the "dragon," "serpent," "devil," and "satan" are all referring to the same entity. This is repeated in Revelations 20:2. In the Old Testament when the Hebrew word translated "satan" is used without the article "the" it is referring to "an adversary." When it is used with the article "the" it is referring to the person of "Satan."

A similar usage can be seen in the New Testament.

Read Matthew 16:23; Mark 8:33; John 6:70-71 and make notes:

Jesus referred to Peter as "adversary" because he was going against the will of God concerning the current situation. Jesus did not say that Peter had become "the Satan." Jesus certainly recognized Judas as such and called him a "slanderer." Jesus did not say that Judas had become "the Devil."

Read Matthew 13:39; 1 Peter 5:8; Matthew 4:1 and make notes:

He also became known as "devil" because he proved himself to be a slanderer of man. A thin line exists between accusation and slander.

Read Matthew 4:3; 1 Thessalonians 3:5; Matthew 13:19; Matthew 13:38; John 8:44; Ephesians 2:2; John 12:31; John 14:30; John 16:11; 2 Corinthians 4:4; 2 Corinthians 6:15; Matthew 12:24; Mark 3:22; Luke 11:15 and make notes:

Revelations 12:9 great dragon

Ancient serpent

Deceiver of the whole world

Revelation 12:10 accuser of the brothers

Revelation 9:11 Abaddon Apollyon





Read Revelation 12:10 and make notes:

A voice is heard declaring the victory and the salvation are won. It is like a song that describes 3 divine historic realities: 1 - God's Salvation; 2 - God's Power; 3 - God's Kingdom. And now the newly established reality; The Authority of Jesus Christ.

This voice is not one of the martyrs in Rev 6:9-11. It could be one of the elders since there is a repeated emphasis on the power. Some think "our brothers" rules out one of the angels. However, in Rev 19:10 an angel declares himself a "fellow servant" with John.

The great tribulation that has come and is about to come upon the earth is a direct result of the defeat of Satan in that heavenly conflict. But we are to know and to be aware that salvation, power, and the kingdom of God are very present realities.

History indicates "things which must shortly come to pass" have taken longer than John probably expected. The point of the message is not one of establishing a chronology. It is to reveal the cause behind all of Satan's attacks upon God's people.

The voice declares:

The great salvation of our God
God is ready to launch the glorious day of salvation
The day of redemption
To bring every believer into eternity
God is ready to save the whole world
Making a new heaven and new earth



Revelation – Latter Times – 11
Read 2 Corinthians 10:4 and make notes:
The weapons of our warfare are not canal (worldly) weapons but they are mighty weapons with divine power for the pulling down of strongholds. To conquer Satan, we must use the same weapons as Christ: Be covered by the blood of the Lamb Share our testimony for Christ Be loyal to Christ even to the point of death
Since the rapture has not taken place, this song of victory is also a song of encouragement to the remainder of the Believers to also become overcomers.
How does this song encourage Believers still on earth?
Read Revelation 12:12 and make notes:
Since Satan has failed, then everyone in the heavens should rejoice and be glad.
The rise of the Antichrist is seen by some as part of God's Judgment upon the earth, or upon the people of the earth. Because the evil of this world has grown worse and worse, God allows man to have his own way and to simply run wild to the inevitable end of running wild; pain and destruction. Men will turn their attention and allegiance to a world leader who promises a type of utopia here on

earth.



Read Deuteronomy 32:10-11; Exodus 19:4; Isaiah 40:31 and make notes:

The woman is enabled to make it to a place of spiritual refuge. In the time of persecution God protects those that are his. The wilderness can be symbolic of being detached from the world and being nourished by God.

The simple reading of this text doesn't indicate the "woman" was removed from earth, only that she was removed from the place of danger to a place of protection that had been "prepared" for her. If we think God must take his children from the earth to protect them, then we are underestimating the All Powerful God.

The "time, times, and a half time" have been interpreted in two basic ways: First, it is seen by some as simply a symbolic time "3 ½" representing an indefinite time period since it is half of 7, a perfect number. Secondly, it is seen by some as a literal 3 ½ specifying a determined length of time.

Those interpreting the $3\frac{1}{2}$ as a specific number still differ as to the number it represents. For some, it is $3\frac{1}{2}$ days. For others it is $3\frac{1}{2}$ years. And for others, it is seen as a day representing a year, which means this is referring to 1,260 years.

If it represents 1,260 years, then it becomes important to determine when this time period begins. For some, it represents the a time beginning shortly after the ascension and ending sometime before the Destruction of Jerusalem. It is difficult to find a starting point where 1,260 years brings us to any event which would have meaning toward ending the wilderness experience.

If the time period is accepted as a literal 3 ½, and the conflict is accepted as between Satan and the Church, several potential meaningful applications can be made. It could be the time of Jesus' earthly ministry. It could be the 3 ½ years the messengers proclaim the gospel. It could be the 3 ½ days the messengers lay in the streets.

Some declare that if it is a symbolic reference then it has little chronological importance and has nothing more than a mystical meaning. They see this interpretation as leaving us with no prophetic meaning or purpose.

Revelation – Latter Times – 11
It is apparent from the text that the Holy Spirit has a purpose in sharing this information. If it is a symbolic reference to an indefinite time period, then it could easily be applied to the time from Jesus' ascension until the time of His return.
What do you believe to be the best interpretation of Revelations 12:14?
Read Revelation 12:15-17 and make notes:
The dragon is infuriated first because of his failure to destroy the woman. Secondly, he is infuriated because of his failure to destroy the Messiah (the man child). He now vents all of his frustration upon the "rest of her offspring" which would be believers in general. The Believers are the "brothers" of Christ.
Many believe this will not be just a local or national holocaust. This will be a world holocaust. What happened at the very worst time in the worst of the historical holocaust will be magnified many times over throughout the world at the same time. There will be no place on earth which is not experiencing the holocaust first hand.
Read Exodus 15:12 and make notes:
Satan will make every effort to flood God's people with tribulation after tribulation. Before any

One interpretation of this could be that the natural disasters, and catastrophes will distract the Antichrist and get his attention temporarily off of the Believers. While his attention is diverted, a remnant is saved from the destruction. It is important to note this is in addition to the destruction that came as a result of the seals and also those of the trumpets.

There are those who believe there will be some nation or nations that don't go along with the Antichrist. These are the nations that provide refuge for the Believers that escape the destruction of the Antichrist while he is distracted by the earth's cataclysmic events.

Another interpretation of the earth swallowing up the attacks of the Antichrist is that the believers escape to the wilderness and thus avoid the destruction of the Antichrist.

If the "wilderness" is taken to mean a wild or desolate place, then it would have to be of enormous size. Considering today's helicopters, spy planes, and satellites, it is hard to imagine an area large enough or desolate enough to hide those escaping the attacks of the Antichrist.

If the "wilderness" is taken to refer to those in the divine provision of God (refer to lesson nine for this concept), then it would not require such a large area. It is simply referring to the divine presence, nurturing, and provision of God.

The attacks of Satan are always intended to be devastating. He sets out to destroy human life if possible and if not, then to at least destroy relationships. We are expected to stand fast and to overcome the attacks of the enemy and to proclaim Victory in Jesus.

Read Ephesians 6;10-11; Hebrews 2:14-15; James 4:7; 1 Peter 5:8-9 and make notes:

God has laid out the most simple outline for us to follow in being overcomers where the Devil and his schemes are concerned. First we must "submit" to God. Secondly we are to "resist" the devil by standing firm in the "faith." If we do this, then we will see Satan flee from us. This sounds better than waging war on Satan ourselves.

What do you believer to be the best interpretation of Revelations 12:15-17?
Write your thoughts and questions regarding this study to share with the group:

Revelation chapter 13 is an important key to understanding the whole book of Revelation. It is important to remember what has happened in chapter 12; because these two chapters make it possible to understand the rest of the book. This chapter exposes the Antichrist and his cohort who will help the Antichrist get so much control over the world.

To understand this chapter is to understand not only the Antichrist, but it opens our understanding to:

- .a. why the end times will have so much evil
- .b. why the judgments of God will fall
- .c. why God will end the world
- .d. how so many of the Old Testament prophecies are fulfilled in the end time

Read Revelation 13:1 and make notes:

This verse gives the image of Satan (the dragon) standing on the shore and watching as the beast, or Antichrist, comes up out of the sea. This image of the sea is explained in Revelation 17:15; the sea represents "peoples, multitudes, and nations." The symbolism could be referring to the continuously disturbed social and political systems that roll in and out like the waves of the sea.

In the ancient world, the sea was often associated with evil. In light of this context, it would very appropriate to see the final enemy of God's people coming up out of the worlds chaos and evil.

Read Isaiah 17:12-14; Isaiah 57:20-21 and make notes:

The Antichrist will arise from among the people! This is where it helps to remember what has been revealed in chapter 12. The world is experiencing increased violence, wars, terrorist activities, natural disasters, and disease. The people of the world are almost frantic in an effort to find and identify a leader. The Antichrist will present himself as just the person everyone has been looking for.

There are those who believe the description of the Antichrist is to be taken literal. This gives a very extraordinary image. It doesn't seem likely that real people would willing follow something that literally looks like the description given in this text. It is much more likely that everything concerning the Antichrist in this text is symbolic.

The "seven heads" is most likely symbolic of the complete knowledge and wisdom the Antichrist appears to have. (Seven is the number of completeness.) This could refer to one who is able to think quickly, make sure plans, respond rapidly to suddenly changing situations. Try to imagine the person you believe to have been the greatest leader of people in all of man's history. The Antichrist will likely be many times greater in his ability to get people to do what he wants them to do. He will most likely be the most effective in getting others to give him unswerving loyalty. A seven headed beast is the appropriate symbol of the ultimate enemy to God's people.

The "ten horns" is the same number of horns the dragon has. This is likely intended to symbolize the Antichrist being not only the representative of the devil by the embodiment of the devil.

The horns represent power and are most likely symbolizing nations. This probably means the Antichrist will be the head over ten nations. Horns pierce and tear in a cruel and vicious manner. This is probably symbolic of the fierce way this federation of ten nations will react to other nations.

The "crowns" represent authority. While each of these nations will likely have someone designated as it's leader, this tells us the Antichrist is the real authority of these ten nations.

Read Matthew 24:15; 2 Thessalonians 2:4 and make notes:

The Antichrist will be the abomination of desolation who will stand in the Holy Place. He will blaspheme God. He will be the man of sin who opposes all that is God.

Read Daniel 7:25 and make notes:

He will speak great and terrible things against God. Each of the heads has a blasphemous name written upon it. This symbolizes the completeness of the Antichrist's blasphemy against God.

After a long time of severe disasters and tremendous suffering throughout the world, try to imagine how hard it might be to refuse to follow someone who appears to have so much charisma, great ideas; and everyone else is deciding to follow him.

How important will it be for Christians to be thoroughly familiar with God's Word when the Antichrist comes on the scene?

How does Bible Study and Discussion with other Believers in a setting like a Home Group help prepare Christians for the arrival of the Antichrist?

Read Revelation 13:2 and make notes:

The Antichrist will have the swiftness to action like that of a leopard. He will be sure footed and not easily overthrown, like the bear. He will have great power in his mouth; the things he says; and will easily destroy those whom he comes against, like the lion.

There are those who believe the description of the Antichrist in this text is speaking of the same "beasts" Daniel saw in his vision; lion, bear, and leopard. There is much of the description of these beasts in Daniel's vision that is not given in Revelation. Also, the beasts in Daniel's vision most likely referred to empires which have already come and gone at this time. Babylon, the lion; Medo-Persia, the bear; Greece, the leopard.

Others see this beast in Revelation as the fourth beast in Daniel's vision. This is more likely than the above mentioned interpretation.

Another view sees the beasts in Daniel's vision as a foreshadow of what takes place in the last times. The beast mentioned here in Revelation is probably meant to represent the strength, power, and apparent stability of the Antichrist instead of pointing towards nations. This beast is the final manifestation of the deification of secular authority.

Some read verse two as saying Satan gives up his throne and power to the Antichrist. This isn't at all true. Satan remains the master of evil. The Antichrist is subject to Satan. The power the Antichrist has is given to him by Satan. It is also Satan, who gives the Antichrist the throne and the authority he has.

Understanding that the supernatural spiritual forces of Satan are behind the Antichrist, helps to explain his extraordinary rise to power. Satan will give the Antichrist power:


Of energy and spirit
Of personality
Of persuasion and influence
Of worldly might

Read Revelation 13:3 and make notes:

The behind the scenes influence and manipulation is further revealed in this verse. The Antichrist receives what "seemed" to be a fatal wound. It doesn't say that the wound was in fact "fatal" but that it seemed to be fatal. Satan makes it appear that the Antichrist has been killed and miraculously healed. This faked healing is important. It is referred to twice and both times it is used as if it gives credibility to the Antichrist (Rev 13:12, 13:14).

Man's dream of a one world government will become a reality. The Antichrist will be the last ruler of the final government on earth.

Do you believe God still performs miraculous healing today? If He does, shouldn't He receive praise, honor, and glory for doing so?



Revelation – Latter Times – 12
Read Revelation 13:5 and make notes:
The Antichrist will be able to say great and proud words. Unfortunately in the midst of his great and moving speeches as to how he can help the world during the painful times, he will be speaking blasphemy.
We are told here that the Antichrist will exercise his authority for 42 months, or 3 ½ years. It is important for us to remember that the Antichrist received his authority from Satan.
Read Revelation 13:6 and make notes:
Read Jude 1:9 and make notes:
It is interesting to note that Michael, and probably the rest of the heavenly host, will not slander Satan. But the Antichrist, empowered by Satan, openly blasphemes God and all those who live in heaven.
What is the message for the Believers today in the fact that the Heavenly beings will not slander Satan or his demons even though Satan and his followers openly slander God, and all who live with him?

Read	Revelation	13:7	and make notes:

Just a side note at this point. Since the Antichrist is given power to make war against the saints, the rapture has not occurred at this point in time. The saints are still upon earth or else the Antichrist would not be able to make war against them and certainly would not be able to conquer them.

This text tells us plainly that the Antichrist will resort to religious persecution. He will increase his power by conquering "every" tribe, people, and nation. The word "every" speaks of just how powerful the Antichrist is going to become.

Read Revelation 13:8 and make notes:

The first statement declares "all inhabitants" of the earth will worship the beast, but then it is clarified as not literally "all" but "all whose names have not been written in the book of life" will worship the beast.

Read Exodus 32:32-33; Philippians 4:3 and make notes:

The concept of there being a divine register listing those who belong to God goes back at least to the time of Moses. The letter to the Philippians shows us that it was still a common belief in the first century Church. Reference to a register of names belonging to God is mentioned about 6 times in Revelation and the reference in 13:8 tells us this register of names belongs to the Lamb.

Some have tried to interpret verse 8 to say that the names of those in the book of life have been written there since the foundation of the world. This is then used to teach a version of predestination that declares those who are to be saved was determined in advance and our evangelistic efforts do not matter.

The straightforward reading of the Greek text will not support this interpretation. The text states simply and clearly that the Lamb has been predestined to be slain from the foundation of the world. It is the provision of the Believer's salvation that has been from the foundation of the world and not the selection.

Read Matthew 24:24 and make notes:

Everyone except the true Christians will worship the Antichrist. The true believers in Jesus Christ will not worship the Antichrist! Christians can support their government but not worship their government. The real Christians will be easy to identify in these last days. They will be the ones who remain steadfast and loyal in their faith in Christ Jesus.

How hard would it be for you to worship God if everyone in your county was openly worshiping Satan? What would you do?

Read Revelation 13:9-10 and make notes:

The contemporary interpretation of verse 9 might something like this: "Now hear this," or "Everybody listen up," or "Let me have everyone's attention."

There are those who believe verse 10 is to be interpreted to correspond to Jesus' words in Matthew 26:52; "all who draw the sword will die by the sword." A couple of Bible translations follow this view. While it is admitted that the interpretation of this text is not easy, this isn't the most simple reading of the original text and it is difficult to explain how this would require "patient endurance" and "faithfulness" on the part of the saints.

It is our human nature to want things to "just be over." This is especially true when it comes to things which are not pleasant. The simple reading of the text is to say that there are some things that just have to come to pass before the end can be declared.

Read James 1:12 and make notes:

Some things simply must come to pass. The living through these things that must come to pass is what is going to require the saints to have "patient endurance and faithfulness." Patience with steadfast endurance while persecution is occurring all around us. Faithfulness with a steady trust even though there is great turmoil and unrest on all sides.

Would it be easier for you to "patiently endure" what must come to pass if you understood what God's Word says about the end times? Explain Why.

Read Revelation 13:11 and make notes:

The origin of the beast; he comes out of the earth. Many believe this symbolic of him coming from the common people. This would mean this "beast" wasn't born into a royal family, or that he was from a wealthy family, or that he was selected from those serving in the high offices of some nation. If this is true, it would be easy to see how this "beast" would be able to have so many of the world's people identify with him.

There are a number of people who try to make some significance out of the number of horns. Some think the two horns indicates he is trying to look like Christ. Others think the two horns indicates he has less power than the previous beast with ten horns. There probably isn't any great significance in the number two of this description.

The description begins to explain why this person is referred to as a "beast." He has two horns just like a little lamb. Hardly anyone would be afraid of a lamb. This may be symbolic that nothing about his appearance causes alarm. If this is the true interpretation then consider the following:

.A. The beast will appear innocent, harmless, attractive, and maybe even lovable.

People may find themselves drawn to his appearance.

.B. The beast will appear to be a follower of Jesus, The Lamb of God.


He may be a religious leader appearing clean and free of evil.

Read Matthew 7:15; Romans 16:18; 2 Corinthians 11:13-15 and make notes:

Why would someone who appears so harmless be called a beast? Because at some point his voice is going to betray him. There will come a time when he speaks, it will be like that of a dragon. This means several things:

- .A. He will be telling lies instead of the truth.
- .B. He will be teaching the word of the Antichrist instead of God's word.
- .C. He will be a spokesman for the Antichrist and not for God.
- .D. He will be promoting the policies of the Antichrist instead of Jesus.
- .E. He will be asking people to support the evil government instead of God.

Jesus warned us to be on the look out for wolves would come who will be dressed in sheep's clothing. This second beast will become a great motivator of the people. He will be able to unify the masses of people into a loyalty to the Antichrist and his government. He will probably hold the second highest position of authority in the whole world. He will sound and look like Christ for a season, but will eventually act like Satan.




What do you believe to be the best interpretation of Rev 3:11?

Read Revelation 13:12 and make notes:

The second beast exercised "all the authority" of the Antichrist. He "made" the people of the earth "worship" the Antichrist. This indicates the second beast will probably be a religious leader.

Reference is made to the apparent miraculous healing the Antichrist had received. This makes it appear that the second beast will be used by the Antichrist to entice and perhaps manipulate, if necessary, people into an allegiance to the Antichrist.



From the earliest of times when God's people were a "called out" people, we have been warned not to follow any false prophet that tries to get us to worship any other than the Lord God Most High. Paul also warned New Testament believers that the "lawless one" will come and perform the works of Satan in counterfeit miracles.

If someone came upon the scene today who performed great miracles, how many of the church people of our community would follow them? Why do you think so?

Read Revelation 13:15 and make notes:
Who will be able to resist following a world leader that can cause an inanimate object like a image to come to life?
Obviously some people will be able to refuse to follow such illegitimate miracles. This second beast causes everyone to be killed who refuses to worship the image of the Antichrist. Persecution is the
order of the day for those who fail to show loyalty to the Antichrist and his government. Read 2 Thessalonians 2:10-11 and make notes:
This universal worship will be centered around supernatural power. The end times will be filled with deception and saturated with counterfeit Christian practices. Our True God is a god of miracles. For those who have come to seek the awesome miracles more so than the intimate fellowship with God, they will find these actions of the second beast to compelling and will be led into destruction.

Do you find any encouragement in Rev 13:15? If so, what is it?
Read Revelation 13:16-17 and make notes:
The listing of opposites (such as small-great, rich-poor, free-slave) probably are intended to indicate the totality or the thoroughness of the beasts control. The mark being placed on the forehead may be a contrast or challenge to the seal the Believers received.
The enforcement of receiving a mark in order to buy or sell indicates a one world currency or economic system. This may also indicate the Antichrist, and or the second beast, is able to bring some economic stability to the chaotic financial world. If so, then this alone would cause many to pledge their allegiance to him.
There was a time in ancient Rome when the citizens were required to show their first allegiance was to the state. Once each year, they had to bow in worship to the state in the presence of some local government authority. When they had done this and proved their first allegiance to the state, then they were given a certificate that was good for one year. Even if this were the only time in man's history when such a thing was required, it is enough to let us know that Satan is not trying something new in the end times.
Read 2 Thessalonians 2:3-4 and make notes:

There are many theories as to what the "mark" will be. The more important issue is that economic controls will be used to cause people to give their loyalty to the Antichrist. The Scripture says only that the mark "is the name of the beast or the number of his name."

How difficult this may be for the Christians who allow themselves to become motivated by finances. The Scriptures are clear about God intending for His children to have all their needs met. He is Jehovah Jirah, our Everlasting God who is our provision and he is El Shaddai, God who is more than enough. The danger is in allowing the obtaining of finances to be a higher priority than being obedient to God.

What are some of the explanations you have heard about the "mark" being placed on the "right hand" and the "forehead"? Which one do you believe to be correct?

Read Revelation 13:18 and make notes:

The number "666" is perhaps the best known number of all literature. Some believe no one can know what this number means. This verse says we should calculate the number of the beast if we have insight. We wouldn't be told to calculate the number if it cannot be known or understood.

There are a great number of interpretations as to what the number "666" actually refers. Scripture doesn't say very much about the number itself, so we should be careful as to what we say about this number. It is "man's" number. The number of man according to biblical numerology is the number "6", one number short of perfection. Man's number is incomplete and short of God's glory. The beast's number is the same as man's number; short of perfection and short of the glory of God.

False religion is the height of man's imperfection. "666" can be representing imperfection perfecting imperfection.

Regardless of how much power a person may demonstrate, how much wisdom they display, or how lovable they appear; they are never worthy of worship. This belongs to God and to him alone. It is imperative that every Believer be prepared to respect their leaders and support their governments, but to reserve worship for no one but God. This will become a matter of life and death in the end times; eternal life or eternal death.

What are some of the interpretations regarding to whom the number "666" is referring? Which one do you believe to be correct?

Write your thoughts and questions regarding this study to share with the group:

Right at the time when it appears to be the height of the reign of the beast; Christ returns with all the resurrected saved.
Read Revelation 14:1 and make notes:
The Lamb is Jesus Christ. He is the Lamb who was slain for our sins.
Mount Zion was another name for Jerusalem. This is most likely referring to the Heavenly City of God. This 144,000 have been sealed with the name of the Lamb and the name of the Father written upon their foreheads.
Is this a literal 144,000 or is it a symbolic number?
Do the 144,000 have two names on each forehead; one being the name of the Lamb and the second being the name of the Father?
Do the 144,000 have one name on their forehead, the Lamb and the Father having the same name?
Do the 144,000 have one name on their forehead, the ones from the Old Testament era having the name of the Father, and the ones from the New Testament era having the name of the Lamb?
There is at least a marked contrast between the followers of the Beast and the followers of Christ. The beast marked his followers with his name, or 666, while the Believers are marked with the name of the Lamb and the Father.

Read Revelation 14:2 and make notes:
The sound of "rushing waters" – forceful, mighty, and drowning out every other sound. The sound of a "loud peal of thunder" – rumbling, stirring, demanding attention. The sound of "harpists playing their harps" – restful, calming, fulfilling. Read Revelation 14:3 and make notes:
A "new song" known only by the 144,000. Only the redeemed will have the privilege of singing this "new song" to the Heavenly Father. Not even the angels will be allowed to learn the song. Read John 17:15 and make notes:
That they have been "redeemed" from the earth does not necessarily mean they have been physically removed from the earth. What do you believe to be the best interpretation of the 144,000 mentioned in this text?
Read Revelation 14:4-5 and make notes:

Some believe this refers to a literal 144,000 who have never married and faithfully remained pure and virgin. If this is true, then it implies that sexual relationships within marriage are defiling. This is contrary to the Word of God. God made male and female for one another.

Read Matthew 19:4-6; Ephesians 5:31-32 and make notes:

The apostle Paul used the marriage relationship as an illustration of the intimate relationship God desires to have with Believers. Others interpret this to mean, while they may have married, they never defiled themselves with adultery or fornication. Some believe the reference to "first fruits" means these are Jews who were saved.

This 144,000 are "blameless" and they have "kept themselves pure." Does this mean they have never sinned or does it mean that they have been forgiven and cleansed?

Read 2 Kings 19:21; Jeremiah 18:13; Amos 5:2; Jeremiah 3:6; Hosea 2:5; 2 Corinthians 11:2 and make notes:

Throughout the Old Testament, the people of God were referred to as "virgin" and when they sinned they were said to be guilty of adultery. Paul used this similar analogy in the New Testament of the church being promised to one husband, Christ.

The statement that these were virgins and pure is probably better interpreted symbolically to mean they are not guilty of sin at this time. To say they have "kept" themselves pure could mean that these are the ones who readily repented when they did sin. Having practiced a continual confession they "kept" themselves pure.

That they "follow" the Lamb probably does not mean they follow Christ as he wonders around heaven. The text of verse 4 can easily be interpreted in the past tense to say they "followed" him. This could mean these 144,000 followed the way of Christ while on earth.

Read Mark 8:34; Matthew 19:21 and make notes:

The first point is their fidelity.

The second point is their discipleship.

The third point is their sacrificial offering of themselves to God.

The phrase "first fruits" could mean a token offering from the very first harvested. But it can also mean they gave God first place in their lives over everything else. God was always given first place.

Read Revelation 14:6 and make notes:

An angel has the "eternal gospel" to proclaim in all languages, to all people. Does this mean the angel will himself proclaim the gospel message or will he instill this message into human beings who will proclaim it?

There are those who believe that evil will be so prevalent and powerful in these last days that mere human beings will not be up to the task of preaching the gospel message, so God will send angels to preach to man.

The intent of God was that all the world hear the gospel message:

Read Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15; Acts 1:8 and make notes:

Whether the proclaimer of the gospel is a heavenly angel or a human preacher, the real point being made here is that the gospel will be proclaimed right up the last moment. The gospel will be proclaimed to the whole earth and not a single person will be left out.

The First Angel Proclaims the Gospel!

Read Revelation 14:7 and make notes:

#1 – fear God – reverence God

#2 – give God glory

#3 – the hour of judgment has come

#4 – worship God the creator of all that is

We are now living in the day of grace. God tolerates to a certain degree the denial of Him and our rebellion; giving us a chance to repent. At this last day, it will no longer be a day of grace but a day of judgment.

The requirement to reverence (fear) God is from man's earliest relationship with God.

Read Deuteronomy 10:12; Matthew 10:28; Luke 1:50; Ecclesiastes 12:13 and make notes:

Reflect upon Deuteronomy 10:12, God speaking to the chosen people of old. Then consider Ecclesiastes 12:13 as spoken through the world's wisest man, Solomon. Then consider Revelations 14:7, as will be proclaimed in the last days. What message does this convey to you? Read Revelation 14:8 and make notes: Throughout the Old Testament era, Babylon was the enemy of God's people. The name Babylon came to stand for: . corrupt political system . corrupt economic system . corrupt religious system In the same way that "Jerusalem" stands for the city of God's people, "Babylon" stands for the city of the Antichrist. The last days will be corrupt, evil, and murderous days. It will be a godless secular society of the Antichrist. This "Babylon" is just engaging in sin, she is "enticing" all nations to engage in her sinful ways and practices. But the proclamation is made; Babylon has fallen! The Second Angel Proclaims the Fall of Babylon!

Read	Revelation	14.9_10	and make notes:
Reau	Revelation	14:9-10	and make notes.

This is a terrifying passage for those to whom it applies. Those who do not repent and turn their lives to God will have the wrath of God poured out upon them. This is much worse than what the Beast declared would happen to those who did not worship the Antichrist. Those who refused to worship the Antichrist would be punished with physical death. This is declaring that those who do worship the Antichrist will be punished in an everlasting torment.

It is important to refer back to the message that the gospel WILL BE proclaimed to everyone before this day arrives. Man has received every opportunity to repent and those who have chosen to worship the beast and to receive his mark will have God's wrath poured out full strength upon them.


For these unbelievers to be cast into a burning pit in the presence of the Lamb also means these unbelievers can see Christ. How painfully horrible this must be; to see the one you denied and refused to believe in as you are placed into an eternal place of torment. They will know with certainty that Jesus was in fact the Son of God and the Savior of the world, but it will be too late to accept him at this point.

In Jesus' teaching about the rich man who died and went hell while the beggar, Lazarus, died and went to heaven:

Read Luke 16:23 and make notes:

There are those who believe this verse like the one in Revelation indicates those being tormented in hell will have their torment increased by being able to see the place of pleasure the saved are experiencing.

The Third Angel Proclaims the Doom of All Who Worship The Beast!



The saints must remain faithful during these judgments and not give up. The people who escape the torment of hell are:

.1 – a saint who endures

The word "saint" means who is set apart or separated unto God. It means a person who has made every effort to separate themselves from attachment to things of this world. A true saint is one who endures in his commitment to God.

Read Romans 12:1-2; 1 Corinthians 15:58; James 1:12 and make notes:

.2 – keeps the commandments of God


Read Matthew 7:21; John 14:23; John 15:10; John 15:14 and make notes:

.3 - keeps the faith in Jesus

Read John 5:24; John 20:31 and make notes:

What do you believe to be the best description of the eternal place of torment?
Read Revelation 14:13 and make notes:
Read Romans 14:8; Philippians 1:21; Psalm 116:15 and make notes:
Read Revelation 14:14-15 and make notes:
There are those who believe the one sitting on the cloud "like a son of man" is Jesus. There is an argument against this view. The next verse tells of "another angel" coming out of the temple and in a loud voice instructing the one on the cloud. It would seem most inappropriate for an angel to instruct Legus agreeially with a loud voice.
Jesus, especially with a loud voice.

Revelation – Latter Times – 14
Read Revelation 14:16 and make notes:
THIS IS WHERE THE RAPTURE OCCURS! (yes, I know many disagree with this)
Read Matthew 13:30; Matthew 25:32 and make notes:
This symbolism in Revelation shows the earth being harvested and the believers being brought to heaven. The point being made is the distinction that God can make between those who are his and those who are pretending to be his and those who are definitely not his. He will be able to collect His saints from all the weeds of the earth. The actual event is described by the apostle Paul as a two step process. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17 and make notes:
When Christ returns to Rapture his living Saints, he will bring the resurrected saved with him. He did this, gave one last call for salvation, and now the 'rapture'. The glorious command is given for the Harvest of the earth to reaped. Christ reaps all the living saved from among the evil and wicked world.
Now that the rapture of God's people has occurred, the wrath of God will be poured out full strength upon all remaining inhabitants of the earth.



Read Revelation 15:1 and make notes:

Not only is it worth noting this declared to be a "great and marvelous sign" but it declares these seven plagues to be the "last plagues."

Just as in chapter 12 the woman and the great red dragon were called signs, so is this scene of the seven angels. A sign is something that points to something beyond itself and in the bible is something that reveals a theological truth.

The fact that there are seven angels with seven plagues probably is intended to symbolize the divine completeness of this judgment against wickedness and unrighteousness.

This is a great place to stop and remember that God is not only a gracious and loving God but He is also a "just God." These next scenes will be of God acting as a Just God instead of the Loving and Gracious God we see recorded in most of our Scriptures. But we must acknowledge that this is a legitimate view of our same Loving God. We need to recognize the grace He has demonstrated through the seven seals and first six trumpets. All of which appears to have been to prevent any from perishing and all to come to Salvation. Everyone had every opportunity to turn to Christ and so very many refused.

Read Isaiah 55:7; Matthew 3:2; Luke 13:3; Acts 8:22 and make notes:

The messages of the Old Testament as well as the New Testament have a constant common thread of calling people to repent and turn to God for forgiveness.

Since this is true, why do you think people have such a hard time accepting the judgments of God as being right and fair and just?

Read Revelation 15:2-4 and make notes:

Perhaps just as awe inspiring and somber as the vision of the seven angels coming from the temple of God, to the same degree is this scene glorious of victory and praise. Those who have emerged victorious over the beast are seen standing beside the crystal sea with harps of God and joining together to sing a song of praise to the holiness of God.

There are those who argue whether there are two songs being sung or just one. This argument takes us away from the important aspect and message of this passage. This song does not celebrate the judgment of God upon the wicked. It celebrates his righteousness and his redemptive acts toward man.

The Seven Letters made promises to those who would be overcomers. They will eat from the tree of life, be protected from the second death, receive hidden manna, have authority over nations, wear white garments, be honored by becoming a pillar in the temple of God, and will have the privilege of sitting with Christ. It is no wonder they break out into jubilant song!

There are a number of people who make something of the "sea of glass mixed with fire." The fire does not necessarily have a specific interpretation such as judgment. It could symbolize the end of the "day" as is the view for a person standing on the shore as the sun sets upon the sea turns it red. The vision of fire in the crystal sea may serve no other purpose than to signify the level of splendor in this scene.

Also, it is helpful to take note that this is a vision and it speaks of something that looked "like" a sea and does not say that it is a sea.

What message do you receive from Revelation 15:2-4?

Read Revelation 15:5 and make notes:

Many believe the "tabernacle of the Testimony" refers to the inner sanctuary, or the Most Holy Place, or the Holy of Holies. If this is true, then this tells us these last judgments come from the Most Holy Place; the very presence of the heart of God. This is not a place of bitterness and revenge; but a place of grace mercy and love and yet at the same time a place of divine justice.

Read Revelation 15:6 and make notes:

Their robes being described as "clean" and "shining" speaks of the noble and sacred nature of their office. The "golden sashes" typically indicated a royal or priestly function. These are not simply servant angels, messenger angels, or even warrior angels; these are royal priestly angels that serve in the temple of God around about his throne. The fact that God selected these angels to carry out the next judgments speaks of the high place of reverence and importance he places upon these events. This is not simply a judgment being handed down by a judge.

What significance do you see, if any, in these last plagues being delivered by angels that come from the Most Holy Place in heaven?

Read Revelation 15:7 and make notes:

Some believe the symbol of bowls indicates there is to be no lid or covering on these judgments. There is nothing to stop them from being poured out. These judgments are a sure thing.

These seven bowls may very well be the third woe pronounced Revelations 11:14

Read Revelation 15:8 and make notes:
The glory and power of God were so manifested that no one could enter into the temple "until the seven plagues" were completed. No one will even be able to go before God to intercede on behalf of the world at this time.
Read John 3:36; Romans 1:18; Romans 2:8; Ephesians 5:6 and make notes:
There are a number of Scriptures that warn of God's coming and sure judgment for sin and wickedness. Is it wrong of us to ignore these Scriptures and only teach the Scriptures which tell of God's love, mercy, and grace? If it is wrong, what harm does it do?

Write your thoughts and	questions	regarding	this study	to share	with the group:	

Chapter 16 consist of the final series of plagues; the seven bowls. We need to be reminded not to get bogged down in the descriptions of these bowls. We should asks ourselves if these events are intended to be literal or symbolic. It could be that the Holy Spirit is giving John the vocabulary of natural disasters to describe the prophetic visions. If this is true then more energy should be expended in attempting to interpret the symbolism than trying to figure out how the natural disasters can or will come to pass. And if these events are intended to be literal, it is more important that we receive the message intended from these natural disasters than it is to understand how they will come about.

It is also worth comparing the "bowls" with the "seals" and the "trumpets." With the seals only about one fourth of the earth and it's inhabitants were affected, while three fourths were spared. The trumpets affected only about one third of the earth and it's inhabitants, while two thirds were spared. The bowls affect the entire earth and every living thing was affected, with no one on earth being spared.

Read Revelation 16:1 and make notes:

In Rev. 15:8 we read that no one was allowed to enter the temple until the seven angels had completed their assignments. This has to be the voice of the Lord.

Read Isaiah 66:6 and make notes:

As far back as the prophet Isaiah, God's people had an image of the Lord's voice coming out from his holy temple against his enemies. The Word of God stands against those who are unholy and wicked.

Read Revelation 16:2 and make notes:

What an awesome task to pour out the wrath of God upon the followers of the beast! Some suggest these will be open ulcers. Others have suggested cancerous sores. Are these to be interpreted as literal sores or is this to be interpreted as symbolic of some kind of pain?
The important thing to note is that this pain fell upon everyone "who had the mark of the beast and worshiped his image." Is there anyone on earth at this time who does not have the mark of the beast?
Read Revelation 16:3 and make notes:
Try to imagine the impact on the whole world when "every living thing in the sea" dies. How serious of an impact would that be upon the inhabitants of the earth?
In some of the texts of Revelation the word "sea" is used to symbolize the mass of people upon the earth or mankind in general. Is this bowl of wrath to be poured out upon the literal salt water sea or is it symbolizing mankind?

Revelation – Latter Times – 16
Read Revelation 16:4 and make notes:
There are those who believe "springs" would include lakes and ponds as well. It doesn't say explicitly that every living thing in the rivers and springs died. But it is a reasonable analogy that it the sea becoming like blood causes the death of all the living things in the sea, then if the rivers and springs should become as blood so would all the living things in them die as well.
Try to imagine the impact upon the people of the earth if every living thing in all the fresh water should die in addition to all those in the seas. What would it be like for the people of this earth if there were no living things in the salt waters nor in the fresh waters?
Is this intended to be taken literally that all the fresh water supplies on earth will become contaminated? Will there literally be no fresh water left to drink? If this is true, then everyone and every creature will die.
Perhaps it is better to take this passage as symbolic as well. If the "sea" represented mankind, what would the "rivers and springs" represent?
What is the source of the water for the oceans? The rivers! What is the source of the water for the rivers? The springs! The rivers and springs are probably intended to refer to the source of the general population. The Antichrist and the beast will have thoroughly convinced the people of the world that they must look to the kingdom of the beast as their source and supply.

The message may be as simple as the fact that all those things the people of the earth are looking to and depending upon to provide for them is going to fail completely. The kingdom of the beast will be as unable to provide for anyone as if the river had become as blood and every living thing in it had died. No food and no drink! No refreshment!

Read Revelation 16:5 and make notes:

Since one angel poured his bowl upon the salt waters and another angel poured his bowl upon the fresh waters, it is not likely that either of these angels is the one mentioned in verse 5. This is "the angel who is in charge of the waters" in general. In the study of Angels, we find Scripture indicates that there are angels in charge of many different aspects of nature.

The angel who is "in charge of the waters" declares God's justness in pouring his wrath upon the waters of the earth. This is not a vengeful act on God's part. This is a "just act" on God's part. It is the love of God that made it possible for unrighteous man to be redeemed. It is the justice of God that requires that those who refuse his love must receive punishment as surely as those who accept his love receive blessings.

Read Revelation 16:6 and make notes:

This verse sounds much like the punishment has been made to fit the crime. Since they shed the blood of the saints and prophets, then they are now given blood to drink.

Read Revelation 16:7 and make notes:

Revelation – Latter Times – 16			
Some believe the speaking altar represents the combined testimony of the martyrs. Others believe it represents the combined prayers of the saints. What do you think is meant by the symbolism of the altar of God speaking and saying "Yes,true and just are your judgments"?			
Are these first three bowls best interpreted as literal events or as symbolic events? Why?			
Read Revelation 16:8 and make notes:			
The fourth trumpet caused the sun to become darkened and there was a third less day. This bowl "gives power" to the sun and allows it to "scorch people with fire."			
Read Deuteronomy 28:22; 1 Corinthians 3:13; 2 Peter 3:7 and make notes:			
In both the Old and New Testaments, we can see that fire has commonly been connected with judgment.			
Read Revelation 16:9 and make notes:			

The heat intensifies. These people must have had some concept that God was in control of these
things because they cursed him. It is rather interesting to note in this Scripture that it says these
people in their agony "refused to repent." It does not say that they "could not repent" only that they
refused to do so.

Read 2 Chronicles 36:13 and make notes:

The "He" in this text is referring to Zekekiah. Sin and wickedness can harden a heart so that it is unable to respond the way it should. When given an opportunity to repent and make a change for the better, the heathen will frequently curse the very God who is loving them enough to give them an opportunity to choose life.

Read 2 Chronicles 24:19; Jeremiah 32:33; Acts 7:51 and make notes:

Have you ever seen someone go through a painful experience that you believed was something like a "wake up call" from God but they simply would not give their life or heart to the Lord?

Read Revelation 16:10 and make notes:

A literal darkness where no one could see anything would certainly cause fear in most people. This event is as likely to be symbolic as all the others of this text. Darkness can be symbolic of confusion or ignorance. If this is the appropriate interpretation, then the kingdom of the beast is going to be cast into confusion. Remember that the earth was in a lot of confusion when the beast came along an promised to bring order to the chaos. Now the chaos is worse than before. One can easily see how people would begin to gnaw their tongues because of the intense emotional and spiritual anguish.

Read Revelation 16:11 and make notes:

The painful sores of the previous plague is still in existence. The physical pain was not enough to bring them to repentance. Now we see that the apparent structure and order of the beast's kingdom being cast into disarray isn't enough to cause people to repent. Note the phrase "but they refused to repent."

What do you believe is the message from the verses for the people alive today?

Read Revelation 16:12 and make notes:

In the Old Testament the Euphrates river marked the eastern boundary of the land given to the descendants of Abraham. In the New Testament it was what separated the Roman empire from the dreaded Parthians. Their expert cavalry bowmen had conquered the world from Euphrates to the Indus.

In the Old Testament God used the drying up of water to provide deliverance and provision for his people; Red Sea to escape the Egyptians and the Jordan to allow entrance into Canaan. Now the drying up of water is to allow the enemy to have easy access.

There are at least 50 different interpretations as to which armies, or king, this text is referring. This simply adds to the confusion and apparent inability to interpret a message from Revelations. When this text is viewed from the standpoint of symbolism we can easily see that the message is probably no more complicated than the fact that all those things the people of the earth look to for security (the river Euphrates) will be taken away.

Read Revelation 16:13 and make notes:


To the Jews of the New Testament times, frogs were unclean and represented evil. he evil spirits seen coming from the mouths of the dragon, beast, and false prophet most likely refer to the persuasive and deceptive propaganda these three will pour out upon mankind. The vision John is experiencing is revealing clearly what is behind their words, evil spirits. Beyond all the physical and earthly powers and secular strength is the real problem, evil spirits or demons.

Read 1 Timothy 4:1 and make notes:

People who have been duped by the subtle and destructive propaganda of these things taught by demons have actually cut themselves off from the source of truth and life.

Read Revelation 16:14 and make notes:

These demons don't just spew their propaganda upon the common people; they go to the leaders of earth and incite them to gather together to wage war against God.



The prophet Joel prophesied such a day when the world would be brought to one location and face war with God. What is further revealed to us in Revelation is that this is caused by the destructive teachings and lies of demons.

Read Revelation 16:15 and make notes:

Some interpret this to indicate the "blessedness" of the faithful few who still remain on earth. In consideration of the earlier text where the saved are taken up in the "harvest" along with the statements that people "refused" to repent it seems unlikely that any saved are on earth at this time. The text does not say that "most" refused to repent but instead indicates no one repented.

This verse is probably referring to how blessed the saved were. They remained alert to the Lord's coming, they kept their clothes (robes of Christ's righteousness) with them, they were taken to be with Christ in the "harvest." All those who remained on earth were put into the winepress of God's wrath. They are not robed in the righteousness of Christ and are spiritually naked and they are being shamefully exposed in the events of these seven bowls.

Verse 15 is like a divine parenthetical statement.

If you found a New Believer in Christ who was studying Revelations, what would you tell them is the message of Revelations 16:12-15?

Read Revelation 16:16 and make notes:

The word "Magedon" is normally connected with Megiddo. This city was located on the north side of the Carmel ridge and held a strategic pass between the coastal plain and the valley of Esdraelon. Many battles were fought in this valley and a number of them are recorded in the Old Testament. This geographical location has recorded many battles and a number of outright slaughters. It was a place where whole armies were wiped out.

There are those who interpret the Hebrew name as "Har-Magedon." The prefix "har" would mean the "Mountain of Megiddo." This has led to quite a variety of interpretations since there is no mountain of Megiddo. When the prefix "Ar" is used it makes it refer to the "City of Megiddo."

The specific geographical location may or may not be that of Megiddo. The greater message is probably that where the armies of this world gather together to do battle against God will be a place of slaughter and complete annihilation. No other place on the earth had a greater history of destruction of life and armies than Megiddo. It was the best symbol of the battle between the armies of this world and God.

When we use the phrase "someone met their Waterloo" - we don't mean they literally went to Belgium and fought Napoleon there. We use this phrase to mean a person met their defeatl; he met his Waterloo. This is probably the same type of usage concerning Megiddo.

Read Revelation 16:17 and make notes:

This final bowl is poured out into the air. This must represent the atmosphere that surrounds the earth. Then the voice of God, as no one was allowed to enter the temple until this was complete, with the simple but profound declaration; "It is done."

Read Ephesians 2:2 and make notes:

Satan was understood to be the ruler of the kingdom of the air. The Greek word "pneuma" was translated three ways; spirit, wind, and breath. All three of these are unseen forces of which we can see the results or evidence of their existence but cannot see them in actuality. This is an appropriate way to refer to Satan and his kingdom. Satan remains unseen for the vast majority of people, but we can see the results of his existence.

Satan has gloated for centuries at the inability of man to see him. Satan has been able to get many people to refuse to believe he exist simply because they haven't seen him. Let it be known that this final bowl will be poured out upon his kingdom. While it may be invisible to man, God has Satan and his kingdom clearly in view.

Read Revelation 16:18 and make notes:

It is believed by most historians that the people of John's day had experienced many severe earthquakes. For them to hear things like "No earthquake like it has ever occurred since man has been on earth" and "so tremendous was the quake" had to strike some vivid pictures in their minds.

Read Revelation 16:19 and make notes:

Whether it is the literal city of Babylon or the symbolic Babylon isn't as important as the message. This center of man's strength and authority will not be overlooked by God. It will have the cup of God's fury poured upon it full strength. As this great city among men breaks into three parts, cities all over the world will collapse. Again, whether this is referring to literal structural collapse of cities or the financial and fiscal collapse of cities is not main point. The message is the total and complete failure of all that man looks to for security, strength, resources, and support.

Read Revelation 16:20 and make notes:

There are those who offer a variety of interpretations in regard to the literal destruction of all the islands and the mountains of the earth. That surely would be an awesome experience. But the best interpretation is probably found in the symbolic use of this phrase. Islands had been used as both places of refuge and places of imprisonment, such as John was experiencing. Mountains had been used as "high places" for spiritual worship as well as strongholds from which enemies were defeated.

If the image is that of all the islands and mountains disappearing, then the message is that there will be no place of refuge and no place from which to worship. Why would the message of no place to hide have significance? The next verse explains this.

Read Revelation 16:21 and make notes:

The word used in this verse to describe the weight can be no less than 60 pounds but is most often understood to be approximately 100 pounds. It is difficult for the human mind to conceive of the damage a hailstone would inflict even if it were the lower size of 60 pounds. But the same impact would have been to the people of John's day. Who could withstand the falling of hailstones of that size? What could withstand them? Every structure of man would surely be destroyed by these massive hailstones.

Read Joshua 10:11 and make notes:

The people had a Scriptural record of God destroying an army with large hailstones. Here the description is that of incredibly large hailstones. Rather than arguing over the actual size of 60, 70, 80, 90, or 100 pound hailstones, let us make sure we understand the message. There is nothing than can protect people from this judgment. There will be no place to hide.

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Chapters 17 & 18 gives us an overview of the judgment that God will issue against the great harlot. Chapter 17 gives us some interpretation of some of the symbols.

Read Revelation 17:1 and make notes:

No ordinary angel is used at this point in the vision. It doesn't tell us which angel specifically, but one of the royal priestly angels that serves in the temple of God is used to show John the judgment that will befall the great harlot. There are those who believe that it is significant that the harlot with her seductive ways is exposed and destroyed before the Bride of Christ is revealed in all her beauty and true worth.

Read Isaiah 1:21; Jeremiah 13:27 and make notes:

The Holy Spirit speaking through both Isaiah and Jeremiah called the city of Jerusalem a harlot because of the lifestyles of the people. (Jeremiah 2:20-31 is another reference of God seeing his people as harlots)

Read Ezekiel 16:15; Hosea 2:5 and make notes:

The harlot was commonly used throughout the Old Testament to indicate religious apostasy or false religion.

Read Nahum 3:4; Isaiah 23:16 and make notes:

Old Testament Nineveh was referred to as a harlot and Tyre was referred to as a forgotten harlot. This is in the same sense that the harlot in Revelations is a city.

The harlot in chapter 17 may very well be referring to more than just religious apostasy. It may be referring to the prostitution of everything that is right and honorable for the obtaining of power and luxury.

There are a number of specific cities that have been named as being the modern city that is being portrayed in this vision. But these images are truly timeless. They portray the basic conflicts of man from the beginning to the time of the end. At the very close of man's history, the great harlot stands as the final intensified expression of worldly power.

The great harlot is seen sitting on many waters. During this study series, there have been several references to water. Each time the question was asked if this was literal water or symbolic. In verse 15 of this chapter the interpretation of water is given; "peoples, multitudes, nations and languages."

Read Jeremiah 51:13 and make notes:


The ancient city of Babylon had a series of canals that distributed the water of the Euphrates river throughout the city. This makes an illuminating symbol of the harlot referred to in Revelation. This is a symbol of the influence that has gone out from the great harlot and been distributed to every tribe, nation, and people.


Read Revelation 17:2 and make notes:

Read Jeremiah 51:7 and make notes:

Jeremiah spoke of Babylon as a cup from which the nations drank and went mad.

Read 2 Corinthians 6:17-18; 1 John 2:15-16 and make notes:





For those who worship the beast, the name of the beast was written on their forehead. For those who worship God, the name of God was written on their forehead. This woman has a descriptive title written upon her forehead.

destruction. This "system" is the source from which every evil vice comes forth. She is not only the mother of "all whores" but of "every obscenity on earth." Does this say anything to us when we hear obscenities becoming popular in the songs, movies, books, and public signs?
Read Mark 3:29 and make notes:
Read Revelation 17:6 and make notes:
The woman is seen "drunk with the blood of the saints."
Read Isaiah 49:26; John 16:2-3 and make notes:
Verse 6 speaks of the intoxicating affect that is experienced by the wanton slaughter of believers This would have happened earlier, before the Harvest, or rapture, of the Believers.
This vision causes John to be "greatly astonished." He was expecting to see the harlot received independent from Cod. What he has soon as for is the harlot adamed as if experiencing great wealth and

judgment from God. What he has seen so far is the harlot adorned as if experiencing great wealth and being drunk on the blood of believers.

Revelation – Latter Times – 17
Read Revelation 17:7 and make notes:
The angel tells John not to be astonished. The true nature of the evil empire is to be fully revealed. The mystery of the woman and the beast with the seven heads and ten horns must be explained together. The mystery involves both and cannot be clearly understood separately.
Read Revelation 17:8 and make notes:
Satan so much wants to imitate God that he tried to convince the world that he had a beast that "was, is not, and will be again." He made the beast appear to receive a fatal wound and them come back to life.
Throughout man's history, there has been a repeated "coming up out of the abyss" to harass and attempt to destroy the people of God. There are a number of Scripture texts in the Old Testament where Satan tried to destroy the savior of mankind by having many people killed. The New Testament records Herod's attempt to kill all the boy babies. Nero tried to kill all the Christians. Hitler tried to kill all the Jews. There may well be others if the Lord delays His return.
The only people who are left on earth at this point are those whose names were not written in the Book of Life. All the people on earth will stand in awe when the see the beast.
Read Revelation 17:9 and make notes:
The statement "this calls for a mind with wisdom" should tell us to use great caution and care when interpreting this portion of Scripture. Another way of saying this might be something like, "The meaning of the seven head and ten horns is not obvious but it can be understood."

The seven heads are interpreted to be "seven hills." There is an abundant number of people who interpret this as referring to the city of Rome since it is basically built upon seven hills. If verse 8 is really telling us that the beast has repeatedly come out of the abyss and influenced mankind, to interpret this as the specific city of Rome may be falling short of the full meaning.

If the reference to the seven heads being seven hills is symbolic then we need to give our attention to the words "seven" and "hills." The word "seven" is referring to completeness. The word "hills" is referring to strongholds or security. "Completely powerful" or perhaps "fully strong." This may be referring to the air of confidence and security which the harlot portrays to others as she draws them into her adulterous ways.

Read Revelation 17:10 and make notes:

Not only are the "seven heads" to understood as "seven hills" but they are also "seven kings." This verse makes it difficult to accept the interpretation of the seven hills as referring to a literal city.

Five kings have fallen, the sixth one is now, and the seventh one has not yet come. Many see this verse as referring to literal kings of literal nations. Those who interpret this verse as referring to the literal kings of John's day see the sixth king as ruling at that time and the seventh to come later. There are a number of suggestions as to which literal kings are being referred to in this passage. Every interpretation that applies this to literal kings has significant difficulty when attempting to make the kings and their reigns fit into the formula and time.

Others have interpreted this to refer to Empires instead of kings. An empire might last a long time and have a number of kings during the lifetime of the empire. Most who use this interpretation accept the Roman Empire as the one who "is now." Some even suggests the empire "to come" is referring to the empire of the Antichrist. This sounds good but the major problem with this is the Greek word used in this text ("basileus") is the word for "king" and not "kingdom." The interpretation as seven empires is not being true to the Scriptures.

Again, if we are to interpret this text as symbolism then we need to focus on the words "seven" and "kings." Symbolically the word "seven" as the word means completeness rather than a specific numerical order. The word "kings" refers to "leaders" whether they hold the title of "king" or some other designation of leadership. If this is the case, the message may be that the evil leadership is almost complete. Saying that the evil leadership is at six on a scale of zero to seven. This is another way of saying the time is short.

Read Revelation 17:11 and make notes:

For those who interpret the kings as literal kings have some difficulty at this point. Which of the seven kings, who have all died and been buried at this literal time, is going to be resurrected? There is a great variety of interpretations as to which king is going to be resurrected.

Verse 11 explains that the beast "belongs to the seven" but it does not say the beast is one of the seven. If we use the symbolic approach to interpreting this text, we can see that the beast was a part of the complete evil leadership of the world's history. He is "going to his destruction."

Read Revelation 17:12 and make notes:

The "ten horns" are "ten kings." Since these kings "have not yet received a kingdom" they are some future kings. If we are interpreting this text as literal, then there is very little we can say about his text.

If we are staying with the symbolic approach then we will focus our attention on the words "ten" and "kings." In numerology the number "ten" was often used to represent man since man has ten fingers and ten toes. Accepting "kings" as referring to leaders, this text is speaking of men who will have a position of leadership and authority on earth. Since the number "ten" refers to man, it doesn't tell us how many leaders, only that these will be physical men and not spirits or demons.

The phrase that they will receive authority "for one hour" is symbolic of a very short time. Again, not a literal one hour period, but stressing the shortness of time.

Read Revelation 17:13 and make notes:

These world leaders in the last days will have "one purpose" and they will give full support to the beast, be military, financial, moral, or otherwise. They share a hostility toward Christ still, even though there are no Christians left on earth. Could this be a human anger and an attitude of revenge about being left behind?

Read Revelation 17:14 and make notes:

They will "make war against the Lamb" BUT "the Lamb will overcome." This summary statement of the battle leaves no impression other than it is a short decisive battle.

The text makes no mention of the part the "chosen faithful followers" play in this battle. It is most likely they are with the Lamb only as observers so that they may witness the defeat of the beast. Who could possibly add anything of strength to the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords?

In light of this statement, it is easy to see why the angel told John not to be astonished at the apparent success of the evil and sinful ways (verse 7). Evil cannot prevail. God is going to be victorious. The church (collection of believers) is going to prevail and evil is going to be destroyed.

Read Revelation 17:15 and make notes:

This verse gives a simple but important key to interpreting the visions. "Waters" represent "peoples, multitudes, nations, and languages." The four fold way of saying "people" probably serves to indicate the universality of the application. Not just one family, tribe, nation, or continent; but everyone everywhere.

Read Revelation 17:16 and make notes:

The woman who earlier appeared as adorned in luxurious clothes is now naked. This is symbolic that even if she was royalty and magnificent at one time, she certainly is neither at this time. This woman who had been earlier viewed as wearing beautiful jewelry is now seen in ruins. This is symbolic that even if she did have great wealth at one time, she has nothing of earthly value now.

Eating of the flesh is symbolic of complete destruction. The burning with fire is symbolic of erasing even the trace of existence.

This harlot was the source of the evil these worldly leaders' attitudes and values. These leaders are now seen as turning on their source and destroying it. If this is their source, and they destroy their source, then they destroy themselves!

This imagery is most likely intended to reveal the self-destructive power of sin and evil. The person who is using sinful or evil means to get ahead probably thinks they are destroying others but in the end they will discover that they have been destroying themselves.

Read Revelation 17:17 and make notes:

This verse is a major evidence against the concept of moral dualism in our world. This is the idea that there are two great opposing moral forces in the universe; one good and the other evil. In the final analysis, it is evident that God holds all the real power. There is no contest between good and evil. Evil has no power over which God must win. The beast and any who rule with him ONLY have power "until God's words are fulfilled."

These world leaders were among the people who refused to repent and refused to worship God in spite of continued efforts to draw them to him. These world leaders relinquished their authority to the beast and were in "one mind." God used them to destroy the beast to whom they gave themselves.

Read Revelation 17:18 and make notes:

Once again the woman, or the harlot, is interpreted for us. This woman is that which rules over the leaders of this world. This woman is representing the system that will sell any and all moral values for the purpose of personal gain. This woman represents the denying of any absolute right and wrong. This woman represents the attitude that what is right or wrong is relative to the circumstances and situation. This woman represents the concept that if it helps me get what I want then it isn't wrong for me.

Write your thoughts and questions regarding this study to share with the group:

It is easy for most people to skip quickly over Chapter 18 of Revelations thinking it is simply a dirge

or lament of the fallen spiritual Babylon. While it is this to be sure, it has an important message for us.
Read Revelation 18:1 and make notes:
Another angel, not the "interpreting angel" in chapter 17, comes out of heaven to announce the fall of Babylon, the great harlot. This angel that comes from the presence of God has such an anointing upon him that the darkened earth is lighted with his glory. This is harmony with other descriptions of the presence of God:
Read Psalms 104:2; Ezekiel 43:1-5; 1 Timothy 6:16 and make notes:
Read Revelation 18:2 and make notes:
Read Revelation 18:2 and make notes:
Babylon throughout the Bible has been used as a symbol of opposition to the advancement of God's kingdom. The literal Babylon of old was a place of immense pride and self-exaltation. The literal Babylon that so oppressed God's people did fall and was destroyed. The spiritual, or symbolic, Babylon will indeed fall in these last few days and be utterly destroyed.

This spiritual Babylon, in much the same way as did the literal Babylon, becomes a dwelling place for demons, unclean spirits, and even the representation of unclean things (unclean and hateful bird). The words "habitation," "haunt," "hold," "dwelling place," and "den" are all reasonable translations of the original text. The point is simple. This spiritual Babylon was a "home base" for demons and evil spirits. If you associated with this spiritual Babylon, then you were associating with demons and evil spirits.

Read Revelation 18:3 and make notes:

Here we begin to receive the insight as to the reason this Babylon must fall. Many people have attempted to interpret this Babylon with a modern city. To identify this Babylon with any specific literal city would most likely diminish the full impact of the message.

This Babylon has been able to influence entire nations to participate in "her adulteries." This denotes the unclean and illicit relationships between her and all the nations of the earth. The nations of the earth, in these last days, will have appeared to have profited from their alliance with the beast and their worship of the beast.

When we try to tell new Christians to separate themselves from the world's system they often have a hard time letting go. What do you think verse 2 tells us about the world's system and what can we say to a new Christian from this verse?

Read Revelation 18:4 and make notes:

Another voice from heaven is heard. This is not the angel that announced the fall of Babylon, but is probably the voice of God since it says "my people." Verses 4 through 8 cause trouble for some people. It calls for the people of God to come out of this doomed city of Babylon.

There are two major possibilities: (1) since the rapture has already taken place, there are no saved persons left on earth at this time, this is a prophetic voice not spoken to the people of that last day but spoken to those of us who will read what is written here in this text; (2) some people responded to the torments of the seven bowls and the calls for repentance and this is spoken to those who have become saved during these last days and they are further instructed to disassociate themselves from this corrupt system. The first possibility seems to be the most likely.

The persecuted church (and people of God) has always struggled with the temptation to compromise with the world system. When presented with the possibility that such a compromise might lesson the tension of living in a hostile environment, our flesh tells us this is the right thing to do. The message of this text is timeless; separate from the world system and values, do not have fellowship with the world's sins, and you will not reap the plagues that will come upon this world system.

Remember Believer, we are chosen to be set apart as unto God for a holy purpose. Can we fulfill our holy purpose while we are participating in a morally corrupt world system?

Read 2 Corinthians 10:3; 1 John 2:15; Romans 12:2; 1 Corinthians 11:32 and make notes:

Read Revelation 18:5 and make notes:

Plagues are going to come upon this Babylon. Since this spiritual Babylon has enticed the nations of the world to drink of her cup of adultery, God will make sure she drinks from His cup of wrath.
Read Revelation 18:6 and make notes:
Verse 4 calls for God's people to "come out" of this spiritual Babylon. Verse 5 gives the reason God's people are told to separate from her; plagues are going to fall upon. Verse 6 gives instructions to what might appear to be unidentified agents to put into action the divine judgment that is to be hers. In lesson 16, we saw that the beast and the world leaders that will destroy this spiritual Babylon.
In lesson 3, a series the martyrs were told to wait a little longer. They don't have to wait anymore. This spiritual Babylon will not receive revenge but will receive divine justice for her cruelty, deception, and evil ways. She will receive double for what she has caused to fall upon others. This is as though her investments in evil have earned interest or that dividends are being paid. And all the saints will witness this take place.
Consider the material of this lesson to this point - specifically compare Revelations 18:4 and 1 Corinthians 11:32. What message does this convey to you and does it give you anything more you might share with a new Christian?

Read Revelation 18:7 and make notes:

There are those who have tried to see some type of conflict between the double portion of verse 6 and the equal portion of verse 7. Verse 6 declares spiritual Babylon is to receive double portion from her own cup for all she has done to others. Verse 7 declares she is to receive as much "torture and grief" as she gave herself "glory and luxury." What she did to others is to come back to her as a double portion, but what she gave herself is to come back in an equal portion but opposite side of the scale.

Whatever the level of pleasure she gave herself, that is the level of misery she will experience. Whatever level of trouble she caused others, she will receive twice as much trouble. This spiritual Babylon has such arrogant pride that she declares she will never mourn.

Read Proverbs 29:23; Luke 14:11 and make notes:

The ancient wisdom as well as current wisdom see the absolute folly in such arrogance and pride. The humbling of spiritual Babylon will involve both torment and grief.

Read Revelation 18:8 and make notes:

Basically due to the arrogant self-confidence of this spiritual Babylon, the plagues will fall upon her suddenly "in one day." Death commonly causes mourning for those who experience the loss in death. For this text to say that mourning will be one of the plagues suggests there will be no one to come along with words or actions of comfort. This suggests there will be no relief from the mourning.


When people mourn it is a common practice for others to bring food. This isn't only for the purpose of eating but for the purpose of fellowship around the meal. There is something in us that finds relief and comfort when we can set down together and share a meal with those we love. This text indicates there will be no food (famine) with which such help can be found.

It isn't enough for this spiritual Babylon to lose that which it loves (represented by death), it also will find or receive no release or relief from it's grief (represented by mourning followed by famine). Then comes complete destruction (represented by fire) which will leave at most only a trace of previous existence.

Read Revelation 18:9 and make notes:

These are probably the very same kings that helped to destroy spiritual Babylon. Now they stand back and realize they what they have done and they personal loss they are about to endure. This illustrates the inevitable bankruptcy of an arrogant existence.

What message do you receive from the judgment of God to the spiritual Babylon; double portion of what she dealt to others and same level of grief for the pleasure she gave herself?



They are terrified and try to distance themselves (stand far off) as they realize how quickly the judgment fell upon spiritual Babylon (one hour). Verse 8 declares these plagues will come quickly (one day) but to the inhabitants of the earth it seems even quicker than that (one hour). The leaders of the earth (kings) stand astounded that judgment could come so quickly. The system they admired so much, the system that seemed so strong and secure, now lies in ruins.

Read Revelation 18:11-13 and make notes:

The list of items mentioned is most likely trying point out how thorough this problem is going to be. It is going to b world wide and not just some local or national economic difficulty. Most of the items mentioned in this text were the primary items of import and export. This is to draw our attention to world trade.

Try to imagine the confusion and feeling of being completely lost that will dominate the minds of those in the business world at this time. The world system set up by the Antichrist, had the whole world connected for the purpose of doing business. No one could buy or sell unless they were signed up on the system. Suddenly, the remarkable system simply doesn't exist anymore. How do we purchase supplies? How do we sell to our customers? What do we do now?

Read Revelation 18:14-19 and make notes:
The profitable relationship (the fruit longed for) is gone. The promise of riches and splendor ha vanished. The realization that it can never be recovered is accepted. Everyone who had hoped to make a gain from their relationship with this spiritual Babylon recognizes their hopelessness. It is emphasized that this is a world wide condition by referring to the sea captains. Several times it is repeated how quickly this came about (one hour).
Read Revelation 18:20 and make notes:
Rejoice "saints, apostles, and prophets" because God has judged her "for the way she treated you." When the saints were still on earth (before the rapture), they were pressured to take on the mark of the beast because no one could buy or sell without the mark of the beast. Now, no one can buy or sel period. Is this justice?
Read Revelation 18:21 and make notes:
There are two aspects of this illustration that need to be considered to grasp the message.
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First, try to imagine the splash that would occur as a large millstone is thrown into the water. Whatever is upon the surface of the water is now suddenly thrown one way or another. In fact it would probably rock back and forth several times before coming to a place of rest again. It may also be moved from it's original location after the surface of the water has finally calmed down.

Secondly, try to imagine what would happen to those upon the shore of this sea. The waves normally come upon the shore with a predicted rhythm. This would cause an unpredictable wave. It would be difficult to determine just how large this wave would be. It would be out of rhythm from the normal waves and would certainly catch many by surprise.

This is the image of the destruction that will befall spiritual Babylon. It will be out of rhythm with that which is normal and usual. It will occur suddenly. It will disturb not only those who are making use of the system (those on the sea) but will disturb everyone it touches (those upon the shores).

Read Revelation 18:22-24 and make notes:

This is best understood as symbolism rather than a literal city. The image of a city with the following conditions gives us a vivid picture of the state of the spiritual Babylon after it receives judgment from God.

A city in which there is no music of any kind.

A city in which no work is being performed.

A city in which there is no light.

A city in which no one speaks loving words.

What insight did you receive from this lesson and where could you make use of the insight you have received?

Write your thoughts	and questions r	regarding this	study to share	with the group:

Refer to Lesson Eighteen. The first part of chapter 19 records the response to the call for all of Heaven to rejoice at the fall of the "harlot" or the beast's system for leading man astray. What a contrast to the solemn and mournful dirge of the kings of the earth! All of Heaven breaks forth in jubilant celebration and praise.

Read Revelations 19:1-2 and make notes:

Some believe this "great multitude" is the host of angels in Heaven. The reference to "salvation" in verse 1 and the reference to avenging the "blood of his servants" in verse 2 make it more likely to be the multitude of saints. Nothing is said about God's judgment being fair, but verse 2 records the saints declaring God's judgments to be "true and righteous."

Read Revelation 19:3 and make notes:

You can almost imagine, just as the praise recorded in verses 1 and 2 begin to subside slightly, another wave of praise rises loudly before the throne in Heaven. The word "Hallelujah" comes from two Hebrew words "halal" and "Jah" which mean "praise Yahweh." This encore of praise is brought about when the saints realize they are witnessing "the smoke from her" destruction. Smoke rising from a conquered foe indicates not only defeat but destruction. The enemy has been defeated and all their resources have not been destroyed. The enemy has been left with nothing.

Read Revelation 19:4 and make notes:

These 24 elders fell down and sang praises when The Lamb took the scroll from the right hand of God. Again, we see them falling prostrate and praising and worshiping God. The word "amen" can be translated as a vote of agreement in "Let it be so" or it can be a testimony of agreement in "It is so." The final appearance in the Book of Revelations of the 24 elders around the throne of God have them declaring "It is so, Praise Yahweh."

The phrase "our God" tells us this isn't the voice of God nor is it the voice of the Lamb. Since appears to be addressing the saints "you who fear him, both small and great," it isn't likely to be on of the saints. This voice most likely is one of those special beings who surround the Throne of God and minister to Him continuously.	e

Read Revelation 19:6-8 and make notes:

Read Revelation 19:5 and make notes:

This "great multitude" in their praise refers in verse 7 to the "wife" of the Lamb and in verse 8 as "her" and "she." This is most likely referring to the great heavenly host of angels. This could easily account for the sound as "mighty thunders."

When the great harlot was defeated and destroyed, the call came for all of heaven to rejoice. In these first 8 verses of chapter 19 we see the "saints," the "24 elders" around God's Throne, and the entire "heavenly host of angels" all praising God.

As recorded in some of the previous chapters, the earth will endure a season when it appears that evil and sin is simply overcoming that which is good and righteous. Regardless of the propaganda Satan will distribute and regardless of how it may appear that Satan is winning, all of Heaven will indeed rejoice and have the victory celebration. After witnessing one apparent triumph of evil after another, would you celebrate the destruction of an evil world system?

Reveration - Latter Times - 19
Read Revelation 19:8 and make notes:
There is an interesting contrast between the clothes of the harlot and those of the Bride of Christ. The harlot's clothes were of bright colors and those specifically that claimed to be someone special. She was also adorned with costly jewelry. The Bride of Christ is said to be clothed simply with "fine linen" that is "bright and clean." There was nothing "clean" about the clothes worn by the harlot. Read Ephesians 2:10 and make notes:
In the explanation that "Fine linen stands for the righteous acts of the saints" another key to understanding can be found. The plural aspect of the word "acts" indicates the fine linen garment of the Bride of Christ is carefully woven from the many threads of faithful service and ministry performed by God's people.
Read Revelation 19:9 and make notes:
Some have trouble with the saints being referred to as both the "wife" and "those who are invited to the wedding supper." This should not be a problem and certainly is not a contradiction. This freedom is a normal characteristic of apocalyptic literature.
Read Revelation 19:10 and make notes:

Read Acts 10:25-26 and make notes:

It is the natural tendency of man to worship that which he perceives to be greater than himself. Peter told Cornelius that it is inappropriate for a man who is a servant of God to be worshiped. It is just as inappropriate for a heavenly being to be worshiped for they too are only servants of the Living God. He alone is to be worshiped and not his created beings. The angels are great and mighty creatures, to be sure, but they are only "fellow servants" with man.

"For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy." This phrase has caused many different interpretations to be presented. Many of these are used to try to give those with the gift of prophecy some elevated position with the Church.

Examining this phrase in the context of this Scripture where it is recorded helps us to see the real message intended. This angel has what would appear to many as a strong gift of prophecy. He is not only telling John what is going to happen but is able to explain it also. This angel is quick to point out that John should not bow to him or worship him.


Look again at this phrase in verse 10. What the angel is saying to John, and to us, is that the spirit of prophecy is not to be worshiped. The "spirit of prophecy" is the "testimony of Jesus." If what we are hearing is not the "testimony of Jesus" then it IS NOT the "spirit of prophecy." A true spirit of prophecy from God will testify of Jesus and point people to Jesus. It will not point people to the one giving the prophecy, nor to another person whom that prophet honors, nor to the organization to which that person belongs.

Read Revelation 19:11 and make notes:

Read Ezekiel 1:1; Matthew 3:16; John 1:51 and make notes:

Revelation – Latter Times – 19
The concept that heaven opens to reveal things to man is not new. The Old Testament prophet Ezekiel saw heaven open and things were revealed to him. The people during Jesus' earthly ministry saw heaven open. And Jesus prophesied that his disciples will see heaven open.
Read Revelation 19:12 and make notes:
Read Jeremiah 23:24; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-8; Hebrews 4:13 and make notes:
The "blazing fire" eyes simply tell us nothing will be able to hide from the penetrating vision of Jesus. He will see through anything and everything to examine the heart and mind of each one.
In contrast to the 7 crowns of the dragon and the 10 crowns of the beast out of the sea, Jesus has "many crowns." This is symbolic of an unlimited authority and sovereignty. As King of Kings and Lord of Lords, he has ALL authority. It helps to remember this is a vision and concrete specific interpretations can cause more confusion than insight.
Read Philippians 2:9-11 and make notes:
There are a number of interpretations regarding the name that no one knows except himself. The most likely is that it refers to a name above all names, kept secret from all of creation, to make sure it is not defiled even in the slightest degree.

Revelation – Latter Times – 19
Read Revelation 19:13 and make notes:
Read Isaiah 63:1-4 and make notes:
The blood that has stained the robe Christ is wearing at this time is not His blood shed on the Cross. It is the blood of those He defeated in the conflict. There are those who argue against this saying the battle has not yet taken place. Again, it is important to remember this is a vision. His coming forth with his garments stained with the blood of the conquered is a symbolic way of showing the outcome of this battle even before it begins.
Read John 1:1; Hebrews 4:12 and make notes:
While He has been given many titles, or names, His name has always been the "Word of God." The "Word of God" is not simply a bunch of lifeless words but it is "living and active" and able to "penetrate" to the greatest depths. And this is what the people of the earth are going to fight against.
Read Revelation 19:14 and make notes:



Revelation – Latter Times – 19
The "breath of his mouth" reinforces the interpretation of words spoken rather than a literal sword.
Read Isaiah 11:4 and make notes:
The shepherd carries a "rod" but it isn't used to lead the sheep. The shepherd's rod is an instrument of war and punishment. It is used to defeat the enemies of the flock, such as the wild beast. To say that he is going to rule with a rod of iron means he is going to destroy.
The stern reality of the punishment for those who reject Christ is reinforced by the image of the wine-press of judgment or wrath.

Read Revelation 19:16 and make notes:

This probably refers to His name being displayed in the most prominent place of a warrior riding a horse into battle. The breastplate and the thigh would be the parts most visible as he rode toward his enemies. Those who have dared to come against God will see the name "King of Kings and Lord of Lords" before the battle is actually begun.

The Greek text lends itself to the possibility that this is either written in two places or is written in two parts. The name could be written in it's entirety in two places or part could be in one place and the rest in the other place; such as breast and thigh.

What do you think is the message for us in the saints going with Christ as his army in this battle?

Read Revelation 19:17-21 and make notes:
This is not a description of the actual warfare. All we have is a summary statement of this great battle. This is the battle so often referred to as the Battle of Armageddon. There isn't much of a battle actually. It would appear to be more like a righteous slaughter.
Refer to Lesson Sixteen, Revelations 16:13-14. Evil spirits came out of the mouth of the dragon, the beast, and the false prophet to go throughout the earth to get people to assemble for battle against God. These evil spirits, as is the normal goal of evil spirits, simply lead the people to their destruction.
Refer back to the lessons of this study series that covered the Beast. Take notice of all the awesome and impressive power, wisdom, and strength the Beast exhibited. Then notice in this text how easily and quickly Jesus was able to capture the Beast and his false prophet. Although the Beast is quite impressive in the eyes of man, he is no match for the power and strength of Jesus.
To the people of that day, to leave a dead body out in the open so that the scavengers could feed upon it was a great act of dishonor. It was the most disgraceful thing that could happen to anyone. An angel is seen calling forth the birds to come a feast upon the slain bodies of those who dared to war against God. These people won't even get the respect of being buried.
Read Matthew 25:41 and make notes:
The "eternal" lake of fire has been prepared for the "devil and his angels." It was never intended for any human being to put into this place. The first two beings that are cast into the "fiery lake of burning sulfur" is the beast and the false prophet. It is interesting to note that these two were thrown "live" into this place of torment.

"The rest of them were killed with the sword that came out of the mouth of the rider on the horse." The beast and the false prophet are captured and cast into eternal imprisonment. The rest of the world's army is defeated by the Word of God. The only one of this evil army left standing on the battle field is Satan himself, or the great dragon. What an emotional impact this must make upon Satan. What kinds of thoughts would rush through the mind of a general who suddenly experienced his entire army being destroyed and he is left standing alone upon the battlefield surrounded by the slain remains of his army?

When reading the previous texts regarding the power and success of the Beast, it is normal for people to experience a certain level of fear and anxiety. Even reading of the success of the false prophet is leading people astray can cause some distress.

Write your thoughts and questions regarding this study to share with the group:
